leaving it of the lower end also I leave to my beloved wife one hundred & furniture
also I leave to my beloved wife all my household furniture during her life & then to be
equally divided among my children - Thirdly I will to my son William Watson one
hundred acres of my land to be taken off his upper end leaving Pease & Corners surveys -
Fourthly I will to my son Jonathan Watson the two hundred acres of land that I left my
beloved wife after her decease Fifthly I will to my daughter Mary one hundred
acres adjoining the land I left to my beloved wife Sixthly I will to my daughter
Elizabeth one hundred acres of land lying between my son William & my daughter Mary
Seventhly I will to my daughter Sarah one hundred acres of land leaving Robert
Young in a survey by its self Eighthly my will is that the remainder of my estate is to be
sold and the money arising from the same to be paid to my daughters Hannah and
Elizabeth to the value of the land that I left to my daughter Mary & Elizabeth if there
is enough if not Mary & Elizabeth is to pay Hannah & Elizabeth as much as
will make them equal with themselves if there is any even to be equally divided
amongst my children - I do hereby constitute and appoint my loving wife and
Joseph Young and brother Willis executors & executors of this my last will & testament unto

my son Abraham Wood John Wood and George Wood as they Marry or come of age to give to each
of them one horse or mule bridle & bit and each of them likewise one cow one feather bed one sheep
one sow and the rest of my lands and living at the death of my wife to be sold and equally divided
amongst all my sons and to my daughter Mary Newlands I do leave her to the amount of four dollars
and I do leave my wife Sarah Wood and my sons Abraham Wood & John Wood to execute this my
