The Mortality of my body are knowen that it is approach, we all men are to die. I make and Ordain this my last will and Testament that is to day principally and first of all. I give and bequeath my soul into the hand of almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my Executors without troubling but at the general resurrection shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and notwithstanding such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give away and dispose of the same in the following manner and form after having all debts debts and funeral expenses paid & provided First I give & bequeath to Ann Miller the two thirds of my remaining estate and Margaret leave the remaining third to her heirs & constituents make and Ordain Robert Macklin and Lewis Leary sole executors of this my last will and Testament and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannule all & every other former will or testament and this and no other to be my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty third day of March in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and Ninety five who is in the presence of us who in his power and in the presence of each other have subscriber subscribed our names

Joseph Whitton Will

In the name of God Amen

I Joseph Whitton of Washington County & Territory belonging to the United States of America south of the river Ohio being now & weak of body but of sound Mind & Memory blessed by God am calling to mind the uncertainty of life & the certainty of death. At this first day of November 1795 make & Ordain this my last will and Testament in Manna I give following etc. First I will that all my last debts shall be fully satisfied & paid and the remainder to be distributed by my executors after manner as follows - Item I give and bequeath unto my son Joseph Rector and to his heirs the plantation wherein I now live with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging together with my Negro boy named John. Item I give & bequeath unto my brother Thomas Whitton and his heirs my Negro man Slave named Ned. Item I give and bequeath unto my Brother Will Whitton & his wife my Negro woman Slave named Hannah. Item I give & bequeath unto my Brother John Whitton & his wife my Negro woman Slave Esther.

Item I give & bequeath unto my Brother John Whitton & his wife my Negro man Slave named Bob. Item I give & bequeath unto my wife Negro man Slave named Ned. Item I give & bequeath unto the remainder of my estate to be equally divided between my four Brothers above mentioned and my three Testators namely Sarah Weston, Sarah Weston, Lydia Wood - and I do hereby appoint these three Brothers Thomas & John Whitton & Samuel Rector as executors of this my last will & Testament. Item I acknowledge by Joseph Whitton as his last will & Testament those who were all present at the sealing & acknowledging thereof the above date Thomas Gandy

Samuel Kelley Will

In the Name of God Amen

I Samuel Kelley of the County of Washington & Territory of the United States south of the river Ohio being sick & weak of body but of sound Mind & Memory blessed by God willing to make this instrument of my last will & Testament. I do therefore make & Ordain this 23^d day of February 1795 Black Friday the 20th of this month & year in the presence of John T. Scott, Justice of the Peace, & a fully satisfied & paid and the remainder of my estate to be disposed of as follows - Item I give and bequeath unto my brother and Sir John Kelley & Henry Kelley & their heirs my two tracts of land adjoining each other in the County of Washington & Boone joined together in the old boundaries and affrontances known to themselves equally divided between them. Item I give unto my son David Kelley the sum of twenty five pounds Sterling money to be levied on a horse & saddle. Item I give are bequeath unto my three Brothers William, Moses & John Kelley and to my sister Margaret Rector the two last tons of iron ore from Henry's furnace of Sullivan County to me to be equally divided among them. Item I give and bequeath unto my Brother David Kelley all that he may be in due me by will bona or otherwise at the time of my decease. Item I give and bequeath unto my two Nieces Elizabeth & Mary Rector the sum of sixteen pounds Virginia money due from their Father Nathan Rector to me to be equally divided between them. Item I give and bequeath unto my Brother Moses son John Kelley all that may be due on a certain bond in my signature on his John Kelley to be equally divided between himself & his Brother Samuel Kelley. Item I give & bequeath unto my Sister Anna Rector all the remainder of my estate to be disposed of at his discretion among his children and I do hereby constitute and appoint my Brother William Kelley & Brother John Henry Kelley my executors of this my last will and Testament and I do hereby revoke & disannule all & every other will or wills testament or testament reciting preceding & setting aside the same by this my last will & Testament are none to them. Item I give and bequeath by the said Samuel Kelley as his last will & Testament before us who were all present at the sealing & acknowledging thereof. The foregoing will was proven in court by the authority of Samuel Kelley (Seal)
