place known to me as all the black house cow sheep hogs farm of wheat are all the grain and hay
shear and money things belonging to the farm and household and furniture Charles & Jacob is to receive
Polly and Catharine nine months schooling and to give Catharine one twenty five dollar saddle
and to give Polly & Catharine one cow & calf a pair and each of them one bed & furniture as
aforesaid and they are to take care of the two youngest girls till they become of age also give my
daughter Polly & Catharine fifteen hundred dollars in the Somersby Bank to be divided
equally between them — Secondly I give to my daughter Elizabeth five hundred & twenty five
dollars — Thirdly I give to my daughter Mary twenty dollars and her husband is to left
to note at my death that I have given him for four hundred and fifty dollars —
Fourthly I appoint my two sons Charles & Jacob executors of this my last will &
testament, hereby revoking all other wills before I begat me as I pronounced
him to be my last will & testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand

provided he does pay my other children in the following manner (manner) my dear Roberta
hundred dollars in such trade as the executors think proper also pay Jane Alexander fifty
dollars in trade at trade rates also pay John Adair fifty dollars in trade at trade
rates also pay Polly Lyon twenty five dollars in trade at trade rates and the following
bequests are to be given to my son the said James Adair (manner) My daughter Hannah is
to be paid in three years after my decease and her Mother decease also my daughter Jane
to be paid in four years after her decease also my son John is to be paid in five years
after my decease and my daughter Polly is to be paid in six years after my decease
Also I will & bequeath to my son James all my stock of horses cattle sheep & hogs. My
former attorney can pick one sled iron. My arm Chair and the Books called the Constitution
Confession of faith and David Balms and he the said James Adair is to bear all at his
own expence and Ezekiel Lyon and Polly to be their Mothers Guardian as long as she
lives in this country. And lastly I do hereby appoint & constitute my son James
Adair and Jane Alexander executors of this my last will and testament
and hereby revoking all other or former wills or testaments by me before
