I Charles Bacon of the state of Tennessee Washington County being sound mind & memory and being weak in body but of perfect understanding of making my last will & Testament to dispose of in the following manner I give to my two sons Charles & John all of my lands that I now live on and the place where it is and all the stock horses cows sheep hogs farm or city articles and all the grain and hay, straw and every thing belonging to the farm and household and furniture beholds & I do hereby give to my wife Polly and Catherine more money to be divided and to give to my two sons Charles & John one hundred dollars each of them one hundred dollars and to give to my wife Polly & Catherine one cow & calf, a pig and each of them one bed & furniture a piece and they are to take care of the two young girls till they become of age & also give my daughter Polly & Catherine fifty dollars each in the Bank of the South to be divided equally between them — secondly I give to my daughter Elizabeth five hundred & thirty five dollars — thirdly I give to my daughter Mary twenty dollars and her husband is to left to wife at my death that I have on hand for four hundred and thirty dollars —

Fourthly I appoint my two sons Charles & John executors of this my last will & Testament hereby revoking all other wills legacies & bequest made by me & pronounced to be my last will & Testament.  My daughter Patsy Will My sole executrix of this My last will &

 One year after my decease. As to the personal estate after the death of My wife
 it is My will that My son Washington Will have the whole of it as I have left
 half of My lands whole to My Grandson Joseph Will. Lastly I appoint
 My daughter Patsy Will My sole executrix of this My last will &
 Testament, to execute this My last will & Testament. In witness whereof I have

 being weak in body but of a sound mind and disposing memory for which I thank God, and
 knowing the uncertain tenor of human life and being desirous to dispose of My last
 substance in the following manner (to wit) I give & bequeath to My beloved wife Jane the
 rent of My plantation to support her and if required Medical aid in the Spring.
 I give and bequeath My youngest son James Adams the plantation at his Mother's decease
 provided he also pay my other children in the following manner (to wit) pay Hannah Robinson
 twenty dollars in such trade as the executor think proper also pay Jane Alexander fifty
 dollars in trade at trade rates also pay John Adams fifty dollars in trade at trade
 rates also pay Betty Lyon twenty five dollars in trade at trade rates and the following
 bequests are to be given to My son the said James Adams (to wit) My daughter Hannah is
 to be paid in three years after my decease and his Mother's decease. also My daughter Jane
 to be paid in four years after my decease also My son John is to be paid in five years
 after my decease and my daughter Betty is to be paid in six years after my decease.
 Also I will & bequeath to My son James all My stock of horses cattle sheep & hogs My
 farming utensils one pair of oxen My iron Chair and the Books called the Testament
 Confession of faith and David Barnes and he the said James Adams is to carry on all his
 own expense and pay Betty Lyon and Betty to the their Mother's Executor as long as she
 lives in this country. And lastly I do hereby appoint & constitute My younger sons
 Adams and Jane Alexander executor of this My last will and Testament
 and hereby revoking all other or former wills or Testaments by me herebefore
 made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set My hand and seal this thirtieth
 day of March 1823.
