

Henry Flyger's will.

I Henry Flyger do hereby make this my last will and Testament in the manner and form following; that is; I do leave to my beloved wife Elizabeth all my real and personal estate during her natural life or widowhood, she paying all my just debts if there should be any at my decease, and at her decease it is to be equally divided among my seven children and their legal representatives share and share alike; and if there should be the wish of my wife and she should have any surplus property that she doth not want for her present use, she may have it so by Executors hereafter to be named, and be equally divided among my heirs, being to my said wife what she may want for her own use and benefit; it is my will that my Executors may sell fifty acres of land called the Winkles tract, also my wife's part of William Ingle's tract, and the other part of my land to remain in the hands of my wife Elizabeth, during her natural life, and then to be sold by my Executors and equally divided among them and to be enjoyed by them and their heirs forever. And lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Otis Flyger and my son William Flyger Executors of this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 20th March, A. D. 1834.

I Daniel Yager of the County of Washington and State of Tennessee, being weak in body but of sound mind and memory for which I thank God, and being desirous to dispose of my worldly substance that I have been blessed with in manner following. After defraying the expenses of a decent and christian funeral of my body, and payment of all my just debts. Imprimis. It is my wish and desire that my family live together as heretofore and my wife to have the control of all the property. The legacy that is coming to me from my father-in-law, Cornelius Yager, it is my wish and desire that my wife Susanah Yager receive it and dispose of the same as she may think proper. Item. My daughter Eliza Yager has received one horse least worth twenty-five dollars, one saddle, twenty-five dollars, one cow and calf ten dollars, two beds, beds and furniture, fifty dollars, one sow and pigs three dollars, one ewe and lamb two dollars one pot and small oven three dollars twenty-five cents, sixteen plates one dollar fifty cents, one bread dish one cent, one

one large waiter one dollar, one set cups and saucers one dollar twenty-five cents, one tea pot, three glass tumblers one dollar, three tin cups twenty-five cents, one pair of pot-hooks fifty cents, one salt shaker, thirty cents, one cream jug and sugar dish, thirty-three cents. Item. My son Eliza F. Yager has received one horse least worth twenty-five dollars, one saddle, twenty-five dollars, one cow and calf ten dollars, one sow and pig three dollars, one ewe and lamb two dollars, one small oven and pair of pot-hooks, one dollar twenty-five cents, fifty dollars in money. Item. My son Solomon N. Yager has received one horse least worth twenty-five dollars, one saddle, twenty-five dollars, one cow and calf ten dollars, one sow and pig three dollars, one ewe and lamb two dollars, one small bottle and pair of pot-hooks, one dollar and twenty-five cents, and fifty dollars in money, and as my son had the misfortune to lose the above horse before he received any benefit from the said horse least, it is my wish and desire that he receive fifty dollars in good land in two years after my decease, or sooner if it can be conveniently done and he to be charged with the fifty dollars. Item. My son Cornelius F. Yager has received one horse least worth twenty-five dollars, one saddle, twenty-five dollars. Item. My daughter Mary Yager, Joseph N. Yager, Martha E. F. Yager, Susanah Yager, it is my will and desire that all that are mentioned in this clause of my will that they receive the same amount as those that have received the first, second and third and fourth term of my will. Item. It is my wish and desire that after the decease of my wife that all the legacies would agree to divide the property, both real and personal between themselves. Item. It is my will and desire that my black boy Charles be well used by my family, and that he wait on my wife Susanah during her natural life, and when my daughter Susanah or Charles comply with the law of the State, he may be emancipated. And lastly. I ordain and appoint my son Solomon N. Yager and Isaac J. Yager Executors of this my last will and Testament, revoking all former wills and testaments. 15th June 1834.
