

Solm Youngs Will

In the name of God Amen

I Solm Young of the County of Washington & State of Maryland being of sound mind and memory do hereby give unto God care, into His hands the Mortality of My body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do Make and Ordain this My last will and Testament that is to say principally & first of all I give and Recommend My soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and My body I Recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of exequants nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God And as touch such worldly estate I leave it to both please God to help me in this life I give devise & dispose of the same in the following manner And I am First I give and bequeath to My dear beloved wife My dear Mrs Sarah Saddle and her share of a cow & calf out of My stock and her bed and bedding with the bedding & all her own clothes & My bed and a Child when of all the rest of My Moveables with One Third of the same I now have On during her Natural life and the full benefit of My plantation for the term of five years and at the end of the aforesaid five years then I give to My beloved son Solm Young One half of said plantation and to My beloved son Thome Young the Other half when he comes of age to be equally divided so that each of them may have timber and good Spring water And I also give to My son Solm Young My Two Saddle & Bridle and my New Ox two hundred Acres of land that lies on the Creek in Annapolis County with Two Negroes with all my goods & Chattels are to be sold and all My debt and lawful debt paid and what remains shall be equally divided between My wife and Children — I likewise constitute Make & Ordain My wife Sarah Young My executrix and Jonathan Bonvillian My son when My executrix And I do declare this to be My last will and Testament and so I witness Whereof I have set My hand and seal this first day of June in the year of Our Lord One Thousand seven hundred and Ninety Six signed sealed published pronounced and declared by the said Solm Young as his last will and in the presence and in the presence of each Other have subscribed Our Names —

I Charles Young of Washington County & Maryland being of sound mind and memory do hereby give unto God care, into His hands the Mortality of My body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do Make and Ordain this My last will and Testament that is to say principally & first of all I give and Recommend My soul to God My Maker humbly beseeching His most merciful acceptance of it through the all sufficient Merits and Mediation of My most compassionate & dear Jesus Christ who gave himself to be an atonement for My sins & is able to save to the uttermost all that come unto God by him being he ever liveth to make intercession for them and whom I trust will not neglect me & returning spiritless when I come to him for Mercy I bequeath I give My body to the earth from whence it was taken in full assurance of a resurrection from thence at the last day as for my burial I desire it may be decent without pomp or State at the discretion of My dear wife and exequants hereafter named who I shall not will Manage it with all requisite provision as to my worldly estate I will & positively Order that all my debts be paid I then give to My dear and loving wife Rebecca I leave all My household furniture and one of the Mares Saddle and bridle and a Negro girl named dice which I allow for My dear and loving to keep and hold till My two sons William & Enoch Young come of age and the land that I now live on with said Negroes to be divided between My two youngest sons above mentioned all the rest of My estate I leave after said wife My wife and George Gillespie My trusty friends I require a part for My daughter Mary as they think fit and the remainder for to before the use of Mary schooling My family Whereof I set My hand and seal this 25th of March 1796

Israel Bacons Will

In the name of God Amen

I Israel Bacon of Washington County and State of Maryland being of sound mind and memory calling to mind the uncertainty of life do Make & Ordain this My last will & Testament in manner following that is to say in the first place I Recommend My soul to God who gave it and My body to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of My exequants hereafter named and as to my worldly estate I will and bequeath it as follows — First I will & bequeath My plantation where I now live containing two hundred and fifty six acres together with all the stock of horse cattle and sheep sheep farming utensils and household furniture and one Negro woman — I bequeath to My three sons Jonathan Bacon Charles Bacon & John Bacon to be equally divided between them allowing Charles and John to be guardian for the same and have the management of his part — the whole of the estate to remain as it now is for the support & maintenance of My wife Mary during her life or while she remains My widow with the consent of those entrusted to dispose of as they see proper to them and their heirs for ever & forever I am
