I John Young of the County of Washington & State of Tennessee being of sound mind and memory do hereby give unto you as my last will and testament the Mortality of My body and knowing that it is allowable for all Men are to die as Man and Ordain this My last will and testament that is to say principally & first of all I give and bequeath My soul into the hands of almighty God that gave it and my body I bequeath to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of excoless nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall revive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touch such worldly estate I have at both places God to help me in this life I give devise & dispose of the same in the following Manner and form First I give and bequeath to Hester My dear beloved wife My several Mares Bred Saddle and her Choice of a cow & calf out of My Stock and her bed and bedding with the bestead & all her own Pothes & My big bed and a Childs Share of all the rest of My Moveable with One third of the land I now live on during her natural life and the full benefit of My plantation for the term of five years and at the end of the aforesaid five years then I give to My beloved son John Young One half of said plantation and to My beloved son Samuel Young the Other half when he comes of age to be equally divided so that each of them may have timber and good Spring water and I also give to My son John Young My New Saddle & Bridle and My New Ox two hundred Acres of land that lies on the Creek in Knox County with two Negroes with all my goods & Chattels one to be sold and all My Debt and Lawfull debt paid and what remains shall be equally divided between My wife and children - I likewise Constitute Make & Ordain My wife Hester Young My executrix and Sonation executrix My son John My executor And I do declare this to be My last will and testament and no other In witness whereof I have set My hand and seal the first day of June in the year of Our Lord One thousand seven hundred and Ninety six signed sealed published pronounced and declared by the said John Young as his last will and in the presence and in the presence of each Other have subscribed Our Names -

I Isaac Bacon of Washington County & State of Tennessee being of sound mind and memory do hereby give unto you as my last will and testament the Mortality of My body and knowing that it is allowable for all Men are to die as Man and Ordain this My last will and testament that is to say principally & first of all I give and bequeath My soul into the hands of almighty God that gave it and my body I bequeath to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of excoless nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall revive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touch such worldly estate I have at both places God to help me in this life I give devise & dispose of the same in the following Manner and form First I give and bequeath My plantation when I was last containing two hundred and fifty six acres together with all the stocks of hogs cattle and hogs sheep farming utensils and household furniture and one Negro woman - I bequeath to My three sons Jonathan Bacon Charles Bacon & John Bacon to be equally divided between them allowing wholly and John to be guardian for them and have the management of his part - the whole of the estate to remain as it now is for the support & maintenance of My wife Abigail during her life or while she remains My widow with the consent of those interested to be paid as they see proper to them and their heirs for ever - I give and bequeath
