## Young Bayless Will.

Know all men by these presents that I Young Bayless of the County of Washington and State of Tennessee being aged and feeble, but of sound and disposing mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me at any time heretofore made. And as to my worldly estate and all the property real personal or mixed of which I shall die seized and possessed or to which I shall be entitled at the time of my decease, I advise bequeath and dispose of in the manner following to wit:

My said Executor is vested with full power and authority to make and execute deeds to all property mentioned in this will to be sold. And lastly I do nominate and appoint my esteemed friend Samuel M. Tate to be
