I will and bequeath to my wife Fannie Brown the land which I own in Civil District No 2 of Washington County Tennessee being the land coming to me from the estate of my father N Brown dec'd as specified in his will having the bearings and corners and lines as shown by the Official Survey made in accordance with the directions of said will. This bequest is and must be made with the understanding that it is null and void unless the conditions on which I received it viz that certain payments be made to my sister M J Haskell and that my mother Phineas Brown receive his support be fully complied with

I also will and bequeath to my wife all property that may belong to me at the time of my death
