

R. G. Bussou Will

In the name of God Amen

I R. G. Bussou of the County of Washington and State of Tennessee being in full health and declining that I must soon pass into the world beyond this mortal life and being desirous to make some disposition of my worldly effects do make publish and declare this as my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit:

First. I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Nancy J. Watson all my lands wherein I now reside containing about 115 acres more or less to have and to hold the same uninterrupted for me during her natural life. I desire also that my three single daughters to wit. Ottie, Laura & Rosa Bussou live with their mother an said farm as long as they remain single.

Second. I will and bequeath to my children my entire farm after the death of my wife to be equally divided between them in the following order to wit. To my said unmarried daughters Ottie, Laura & Rosa I wish & desire that they shall have that portion of my farm lying north of the road leading from the Graceboro road & running south of the dwelling house through said farm including the dwelling house and buildings thereon to have and to hold the same for ever. In addition to this last bequest I will that my said three daughters shall have woodland lying and adjoining James S. Beard & others. I desire the line to run beginning at the gate on the south side of the road near the cabin and running from said gate up the hollow in a southerly direction along a private wagon road to a stake near a bluff of rocks then running across the bluff of rocks about a west course in a hollow to Prichett's hill then running with Prichett's hill to a fence about a south course following the fence to my outside fence & stake near a sycamore tree then with my fence a straight line to Jacob Adlers hill a little east of my hickory corner to have the same forested.

Third. I will and bequeath to my daughter Sally Hartwood twelve acres of my farm including the house and other buildings where they now live. the same beginning at Adlers hill about 100 yards or more above J. S. Richards corner then running down to the road near a north

course, thus running to the pond on the top of the hill so as to inclose about one fourth of said land and so as to include said 12 acres to have and hold the same forever. In addition to said 12 acres I desire that my said daughter Sally shall have the privilege of getting fire wood such as bacon timber and enough rail timber off the other portion of my farm for their own use & to fence on said 12 acres no more.

Fourth. The balance of my farm I will to my two daughters Ellie & Mattie to have and to hold the same forever.

Fifth. I will and bequeath to my three grand children heirs of my deceased daughter Minnie Bussou twenty five dollars each which shall be paid by said two daughters Ellie & Mattie out of their share within one & two years after the death of my said wife.

Sixth. I will and bequeath that my wife and three daughters Ottie, Laura & Rosa have their choice with cows & calves, and the brown horse, including all my house hold & kitchen furniture of every description equally.

Seventh. I will that the balance of my personal property of every kind and description be sold at public sale to the highest bidder and the proceeds thereof be paid over to my wife for her comfort. After the payment of my debts and funeral expenses.

I do hereby will that a road shall be left open along the fence on Prichett's hill or my line so as to give access to the other hills. I appoint Nathaniel Galloway Executor of this my last will and testament.
