

# Richard Chinoweth's Will

I Richard Chinoweth of Washington County and State of Tennessee being weak of body and knowing the uncertainty of human life and desiring to arrange my worldly business while I am possessed of a disposing mind and memory do make ordain and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills made by me at any time in the past and declaring this to be my only last will and testament First It is my desire that my Executor after my death out of the first money coming into his hands belonging my estate shall pay all my just debts

Secondly I give and bequeath unto Emily Chinoweth wife of my son William Chinoweth to her and her heirs for apigns forever my house and lot in the town of Johnson City situated on Kings St adjoining the property occupied by Dr G. S. Miller the same being in the County of Washington and State of Tennessee with every thing connected therewith

Thirdly - It is my will and desire that my executor shall sell my farm in Buffaloe ridge civil district the same being situated adjoining the lands of George Gray Chamberlain Hale and others of the aforesaid County & State in the manner that he may think will produce the greatest amount of money and the proceeds of said farm shall be applied as follows first I give to my grand son Daniel Fox ten dollars second I give to my two grand children Addie and Robert Dyer Amanda Cooper Elizabeth Dyer and the heirs of Martha Chase equal shares of the remainder of my estate after paying the several amounts heretofore named those herein after named together with my debts and it is my will that my executor pay to John Chinoweth heirs four dollars It is my will that my executor release a debt due me from the estate of James M Chinoweth my son and this is all that the heirs of my son James M Chinoweth is to receive of my estate In brief I give to Emily Chinoweth my house & lot in Johnson City and all the crop growing on my farm to Daniel Fox ten dollars to the heirs of John Chinoweth five dollars to the heirs of James Chinoweth I release all that is due

me from their fathers estate after paying my debts I will that all the remainder of my property of every kind be devised unto him by my Executor divided into four equal parts when collected or converted into cash and one part paid to Addie and Robert Dyer one to Amanda Cooper one to Elizabeth Dyer and the other fourth to the heirs of Martha Chase beginning on her body and if she dies then to my other children equally that is my son in law Nelson Chase is in no event to have any part of my estate

In testimony hereunto I set my hand and seal on this 24 day of April 1878 in the presence of the subscribing witnesses

# Rebecca Cartwright's Will

State of Tennessee May the 6<sup>th</sup> 1878  
Washington County I now all persons whom I may concern that I be Rebecca Cartwright do this day make this my last will and testament First I will all my just debts and funeral expenses to be paid Then will am quit to each one of George Hamilton girls all my remaining personal effects including one hundred acres to me for three hundred dollars given on the 24<sup>th</sup> day of November 1877 by the heirs of William Cartwright my husband deceased I will to my brother George Hamilton to hold and use his lifetime then to be divided between his heirs in equal degree I appoint William H King my Executor Rebecca Cartwright my

The foregoing will was presented to the Court for probate at the August Term 1879, and proven by the oaths of Thomas Brown & C. H. Atchell the two subscribing witnesses thereto & ordered to be recorded. William H. King was allowed to the next term to give bond.

## Samuel E. Edwards Will

In the name of God amen. I Samuel E. Edwards of the State of Tennessee Washington County having been permitted to live my three score & ten years and longer and being in full health but of varied disposing mind and knowing of the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time thereof and being desirous to set my house in order for my departure do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form to wit

1<sup>st</sup> and principally I will soul to God who gave it and my body to be decently buried. 2<sup>nd</sup> I will that my funeral expenses be paid out of my personal effects and that all my just and honest debts be paid from the same source.

3<sup>rd</sup> I will and bequeath to my wife Mary Edwards as a dower during her life or while she remains my widow to have hold and occupy and control for her use and for the use of the family and especially for the raising and education of my youngest son Samuel-Judson Edwards, the farm upon which I now live and have lived for the last twenty five years with all its appurtenances and buildings. said farm contains one hundred acres more or less and is bounded north and West by Carr East by G P Haw South by Dr A Martin

Furthermore. I will that all the stock I now own, all the farming utensils, shop tools, and two unfinished wagons I have, be for the use of my widow and the family that may remain with her while she

lives or is my widow.

4<sup>th</sup> I will and bequeath to my daughters Mary Elizabeth Edwards and Maria Louisa Edwards and son Joshua Dill Edwards the West end of the old Joshua Edwards farm in Sullivan County Tennessee, the hundred and thirty eight acres more or less bounded as follows on South by Bullock Jones & Rader West by Longacres Rutledge North by Rutledge East by that part of the old Edwards tract run off to Owen Edwards and twenty acres to Joseph Longacre including the old Edwards brick house and log barn and also buildings now occupied by Nick Rodgers. said children to pay me the sum of One-hundred dollars each and to have and to hold said land jointly and equally to be valued or divided as they may agree upon.

5<sup>th</sup> I will and bequeath to my daughter Eliza Ann Worrell and son Abel Washington Edwards to have and to hold jointly and equally the north East end of the Joshua Edwards farm in Sullivan County Tennessee containing one hundred and five acres more or less being the twenty acres formerly run off to Joseph Longacre and Eighty five to Owen Edwards including the building now occupied by Sam Swelling bounded on the North by Harbridge East by Feathers South by Jones West by that part of the Edwards farm laid off to Samuel, E & Elbert Edwards. The western line beginning at the Bullock line running up the Spring branch to Spring thence in a straight line across the orchard to the Harbridge line. Said children to pay me the sum of four hundred dollars (200 dollars each) in equal annual installments of fifty dollars (twenty five each) beginning January 1<sup>st</sup> (1879) Eighteen hundred and seventy nine.

6<sup>th</sup> In consideration of educational advantages superior to the other children before of age my son David St Edwards requests that he be allowed nothing in the Estate disposed of by this will. I therefore will in accordance with his wish

7<sup>th</sup> I will and bequeath to my son Samuel Judson Edwards this home tract or parcel of land
