That my Executor be required to sell the above mentioned tract of land & apply the proceeds to the payment of my Doctors bill which may be due him at the time of my death and to the payment of my funeral or burial expenses and any lawful debts if any are owing at that date name by the date of my death and after these debts are paid I will & bequeath the balance of the proceeds of the sale of said land to my three oldest Children & their heirs in said balance shall be equal

The aforesaid three oldest Children being David J. Cauley Samuel R. Cauley and Joseph Cauley

I will and bequeath my other tract of land containing thirteen acres more or less in said district 13 of said County adjoining the lands of E. A. Shipley D. S. Crumleys heirs and others to Joseph A. Cauley my husband & to my two youngest Children namely Lafayette Cauley & Alexander C. Cauley and the share of my husband & the two youngest Children to be equal in this last mentioned tract of land

I also will and bequeath my personal property to my husband and five Children jointly to be divided among my six mentioned heirs and ask that they the heirs must be allowed to divide the personal property amongst themselves privately

I also appoint E. L. Deadrick of Washington County Tennessee the Executor of this my last will and Testament and ask that no bond be required of him
