 of this my last will & testament & give & confer in him full power
 & authority to sell said land as herein directed & for the purposes
 herein named.

In the name of God Amen

I Harvey N. Chase of the County of
 Washington and State of Tennessee being feeble in health but of sound mi-
 nd and memory and realizing the uncertainty of human life do hereby
 make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking and
 making void all other wills ^{by me} heretofore made

First - I will my soul to God and my body to be decently buried and
 my funeral expenses to be paid by my beloved wife Elizabeth Chase as well
 as my debts I may justly owe at that date

Secondly - For the love and affection that I have for my wife Elizabeth
 Chase and the kindness she has shown me all through life I give will
 and bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth Chase that tract or parcel of land
 upon which I now live more particularly described in the several deeds
 I now hold and own in my possession and said tract of land containing
 250 Acres and is described in the above named deeds my wife is
 to have the full and exclusive control of said tract of land to see and
 warrant the same to the best advantage for the support of herself and my

 her natural life

Third - I will unto my son Andy S. Chase the privilege of living
 in and using the home he now lives in known as the old Chase home or
 to build a new one any where near the old one and I further will that my

 side of the tract of land described as will be necessary for his support or at

 own use

 the tract of land above named be sold to the best advantage and the proceeds
