Copp & the Heirs of my body But no other. But should it so please an alwise Providence to remove me from hence without further accessions to my family, Then I desire the 2d clause of this my last will and testament strictly complies with 4th I hereby nominate and appoint Bruce Broyle Executor of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me at any time made
