

Henry Sliger Will

I Henry Sliger being weak in body but of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament
1st It is my will that my Executors to be hereinafter named shall pay my Doctors bill and funeral expenses and any other debts I may owe out of the first money that may come into his hands and for that purpose shall proceed as soon as possible to collect all moneys and accounts due me.

2nd I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Catherine Sliger the balance of my Estate both real and personal of every description to be used and controlled by her during her life time as she may see fit and at her death it is my wish that my Estate be divided equally between my children except that my Executor shall charge my son H M Sliger with \$100⁰⁰ being the amount advanced him by me in the purchase of horses.

3rd In the event that my real Estate cannot be equally divided between my children then it is my will that my lands be sold by my Executor at public sale to the highest bidder on a credit of twelve months or upon longer time if he thinks it to the interest of my heirs so to do. 4th I nominate and appoint my friend Samuel Replinger my Executor of this my last will &c

Second. I do not want James I Cox and Charles Cox to be pushed to land for five years and I want Jenn. Martin to have five years also to settle up with the rest of the heirs.

I want my carpenter tools sold to the highest bidder And and the Balance of the farming tools to Jenn. also one horse to Jenn. Martin. Also our cow to be sold with the tools.

I want Jenn. Martin to have one bed so that he will be equal with the rest of the heirs.

I want my lawful Executor to settle with all the heirs and cancel the interest if there is any and deduct from that that's had more than their equal share

Sarah A Bowman Will

I Sarah A. Bowman wife of David Bowman deceased of the County of Washington State of Tennessee being of sound mind and memory do make and publish this as my last will and testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made as follows to wit

First. I will that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any moneys or other properties that I may be possessed of

youngest daughter all the beds and bed clothing belonging to
beds, pillows and Bolsters and Bedsteads and cords inside sheet ticks
and feather beds also one corner Cupboard in his house including
dishes of all kinds, also spoons, knives and forks, also one kitchen
Cupboard and all that is in it including dishes & one safe
and all that is in it 2 Trunks and all that is in them
3 folding leaf tables and one kitchen table one cooking stove
and all vessels belonging thereto. Also one cast kettle and
one pot one Brass kettle 11 gallons and one small Brass kettle
and one sewing table one candle stand and one clock one
dugger and half chairs one chest and all in it one wood mill
one Wagon, one set of hind gears one pair of flange gears one
cutting box, 2 axes chopping, one matook, one cradling board, one
mowing scythe. Also will to Navajanos's very youngest daughter
all of the plows one log chain, all of crocks & pots and all
of the wooden ware 2 Surries, 2 shovels and tongs and doghouse
one big shovel.

What Stock of different kinds may be left at my death and also what grain of different kinds may be on hands at my death. one side Saddle also wooden bars also all the Barrels of different kinds. Balances of measure on hands after other expenses paid. Balances to be given to Wamoyanaw. Bannan one big wheel one Reel 1 ft. stock yards all of the tin ware 1 saw 1 drawing knife 2 Hay forks and 1 grain shovel 2 Iron wedges 2 Smooth Irons 2 riding blades 1 glass heddle 1 gear and Reel for loom 1 small quilt wheel 5 ladles 1 flesh fork 1 cake turner 1 hairnet salt & other things on hands not mentioned elsewhere all metal work all pot metal on hands all the carpentry & working spools.
