

# Alexander M. Wilson's Will

I Alexander M. Wilson being of sound mind and memory, and feeling the uncertainty of life, do make and publish this as my last will & testament hereby revoking and making void all other wills by me at any time made first I direct that my funeral expenses, and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any moneys that I may die possessed of or may come first into the hands of my executors.

Secondly I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Anna Wilson my beauveau and Book Case, and all my books during her life. The books after her death to be equally divided between my children and my grand children. Also to have an ample Mendurance furnished her by Sacin A Bradshaw out of the productions of my farm, and also to be furnished with a sufficient quantity of Clothing in kind and quality suitable to her age and station to make and render her comfortable. She is also to have one room in the house we now occupy for her own use, and to have choice of said rooms. She is also to have one bedstead, bed and bed clothing of sufficient quantity for one bed which she may dispose of at her death as she may think proper.

Thirdly having advanced heretofore of my estate to my son George W. Wilson and my daughter Nancy Wilson wife of William Kannah in their lifetime their proportion of my estate real and personal, I give and bequeath to Sacin A Bradshaw and my daughter Phebe M Bradshaw my farm, that I now live on, by the said Sacin A Bradshaw paying a note of hand that Col George W. Nelford now holds against me as security for George W. Wilson and his friends to bring or cause to be brought from the State of Arkansas (near Fort Smith) to the State of Tennessee Washington County near Washington Collected my two Grand <sup>^</sup> Emma and Tennessee A. Kannah Children of Nancy and William Kannah deceased.

And fourthly I do hereby nominate and appoint Sacin A Bradshaw my executor, without being required to give <sup>in</sup> any bond for the execution of this my will. In witness whereof I do to this my will set my hand and seal this 3<sup>rd</sup> day of December 1872.

# Wines A Deakins Will

In the name of God amen I James A Deakins of the County of Washington and State of Minnesota in perfect health of body and of perfect mind & memory thanks be given unto God; calling unto mind the mortality of my body. Knowing it is appointed once for all men to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul to unto God that set me my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent burial and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with in this life I give demise and dispose of in the following manner & form

First I give and bequeath 1 to my beloved wife Anna Deakins the following property to wit all the personally property that she brought to my house to dispose of as she sees proper 2 all my lands containing two hundred and fifty acres more or less known by my description during her widowhood or natural life 3 one bay mare one cow mare and necessary gearings for the same one Carting Box knife one Doil Dan one large turning plow two share plows and stocks - one falling ax one two horse wagon - one pair of Slatchers - one double tier two small swing tressel head of milk Cows ten heads of Sheep all the my hogs one Cooking Stove and fixtures for the same one clock and my beloved wife is to have back of my house hotel and Kitchen furniture as she may need & etc I give and bequeath to my son William M. Deakins one bed and fixtures for the same etc I give and bequeath to my son James M. Deakins one bed and fixtures etc I give and bequeath to my son John Deakins one bed and fixtures

I give and bequeath to my son Henry Deakins two  
hds and fixtures one cow and calf two years and lamb  
I give and bequeath to my son R. M. R. Deakins  
one cow and calf two years and lamb two hds and  
fixtures for the same and my new family Bible  
I give and bequeath to my Grandson George W. Brown  
one horse saddle & bridle worth one hundred and twenty  
five dollars and one hundred of clothes and <sup>to be sent</sup>  
to school till he acquires a sufficient education to  
transact his business and the tuition to be paid out  
of my estate by Executors to Deakins and R. M. R.  
Deakins I give and bequeath to my grand daughter  
Asah Brown one side Saddle which formerly be  
longed to her deceased Grandmother Deakins and twenty  
five dollars I give and bequeath to my grand  
daughter Clarissa Brown forty dollars I also give and  
bequeath to my grand daughter Margaret Brown forty dollars  
for the love and good will I have for the aforesaid chil-  
dren in addition to and besides by their deceased mother  
Sissanna Brown &c It is also my will that the aforesaid  
children and my two sons R. M. R. Deakins  
and Henry Deakins remain at my second domicile with  
my beloved wife and that R. M. R. Deakins manage  
and control said farm and shall receive one third of  
the products so produced. It is my will that R. M.  
Deakins manage and transact business for his brother  
Henry Deakins it is also my will that all my personal  
property not named in other my last will and testament  
is to be sold at public auction and the proceeds of  
which to the payment of my funeral expenses and my  
debts first and the remainder to be equally divided  
between my lawful heirs and after the death of my second wife  
Hannah Deakins all the my personal property and lands  
are to be sold at public auction and the money to be equally  
divided between my lawful heirs or their affigrs. It is also  
my will that John Deakins and R. M. R. Deakins be  
guardians for my son Henry Deakins I also appoint my two  
sons John Deakins and R. M. R. Deakins co-executors

I will that my two sons David M. Parker and John D. Parker  
have all the real estate consisting of one hundred and  
fourteen acres of land be the same more or less and also the  
remainder of the personal property to be equal partners in  
both and to divide the same themselves as they may think  
best  
I will that David M. Parker and John D. Parker pay my  
son William P. Wilson fifty dollars in U. S. currency and  
<sup>I also give my son William Wilson one good bed bedding &c</sup>  
of the value of the property above willed to them  
I appoint D. W. D. Peoples my Executor to carry out this  
will I am witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand  
and affixed my seal on this 13 day of February 1873
