I Benjamin Ford do make and publish this my
 last will and testament, hereby revoking and make
 my said all other wills by me at any time made
 That I direct that my funeral expenses and all my
 debts be paid as soon after my death as possible, out
 of my moneys things I may be possessed of or may first
 come into the hands of my executor. Secondly I give
 and bequeath to my four girls now at home to viz
 Nancy Ford Cynthia Ford Martha Ford and Susanah
 Ford their Equal share of the land in the tract I now
 live on and reside My will is they have the North end
 of the farm where the house and barn stands and all
 the other improvements around them and the spring I
 now use out of and I further bequeath unto them all
 the house hold and kitchen furniture inclusive or ap-
 portioning them and further bequeath unto the above named
 heirs and my three sons Benjamin Ford Monarca P. Ford
 and George W. Ford the part of land that my daughter
 Roda Ford & Deced. would have been entitled to if had been
 to be equally divided with the above named heirs. Thirdly
 I bequeath unto my five sons John A. Ford William
 Ford Benjamin Ford Mordecai P. Ford and George W.
 Ford their Equal share of said lands I now own one
 share each to have their part on the South side of
 said farm and further my will is that my daughter
 Elizabeth Cress now on share with said son South part

I will my wheat oats and corn to the above named children for their lives for twelve months the surplus to Nancy and Cynthia if any. I have willed my land to all my children here time ago This will shall not testify my former will respecting the land this the 13th day of June 1874

I Sarah Bashore of the County of Washington & State of Tennessee, being sick and weak in body but of sound and disposing mind, memory, and understanding, considering the certainty of Death and the uncertainty of the time thereof and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs and thereby to the better prepare to leave this world when it shall please God, to call me home. I do therefore make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following: that is to say, First and principally I commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God and my body to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors hereafter named. I devise and bequeath as follows
