# William Gibbons Will.

State of Tennessee Washington County March 6<sup>th</sup> 1884.  
My last Will and Testament

I William Gibbons of the  
aforesaid County and State do hereby make my last will  
and Testament in manner and form as follows:

1<sup>st</sup> - I desire that all the perishable part of my estate be immediately sold after my decease and out of the proceeds arising therefrom, all my just debts and funeral expenses shall be paid. 2<sup>nd</sup> - After the payment of my debts and funeral expenses I desire to give to my wife Hannah all the remainder of my estate both Real and personal for and during her natural life and after her decease, I give to my children hereinafter mentioned as follows. 3<sup>rd</sup> I give to my daughters Minerva L. - Abigail J. and Harriet E. Gibbons part of my tract of land adjoining the lands of the C. V. W. & Co. R. R. Co. forty Rods wide; the same to be enjoyed by the said Minerva L. - Abigail J. and Harriet E. Gibbons and their heirs forever. 4<sup>th</sup> I give to my son T. J. Gibbons, after he has paid to my daughter Maggie Hodge, the sum of One Hundred Dollars in Cash, all the remainder of my estate both real and personal of whatsoever kind or nature it may be, not heretofore particularly disposed of. And lastly I do appoint my son T. J. Gibbons as executor of this my last will, and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal, this 6<sup>th</sup> day of March in the year of Our Lord 1884. Signed sealed published William Gibbons Seal and declared in presence of us as the last will and Testament of William Gibbons.
