

William Haws Will

In the name of God ourin: I William Haws of the County of Washington and State of Tennessee Being of sound mind, alid memory and Considering the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life do make ordain publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament

That is to say first I bequeath unto my beloved wife Amanda Jane her support and maintenance off of the products of my farm during her life or widowhood of good and wholesome food and good and comfortable clothing the above mentioned to be ample in kind and quality to render her comfortable both sickness and health so long as she lives or remains my widow and she is to have the sole and undivided possession of the room in the North end of the dwelling house during rooms and kitchen and also the possession and control of all the personal property that she brought with her when I married her to dispose of as she thinks proper at her death or marriage.

Second I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Marista Eaves and her bodily heirs a portion of my real estate off of the upper end or side of my farm adjoining the lands of John Braden heirs, John and Thomas Williams. Beginning for the division line at a black gum corner to John Braden heirs, thence N 33° E one pole to stake at a fence 1 56 1/4 E 55 poles to stake and corners, 1 30° N 91 poles to a stake in a lane corner to John Williams and Thos Williams N 46° W 38 1/4 poles to a stake near the corner of a field N 39 E 8 1/2 poles to a stake in the mouth of a gully, thence N 58 W crossing the creek to John Bradens heirs line and with the same to begining supposed to contain 75 acres be the same more or less. I reserve to myself and my heirs the right of a wagon way or road through the above described land forever to haul rails firewood and timber to the farms & river lots upon. I also give and bequeath to my above named daughter our third of my stock in the East Tennessee and Virginia Rail Road Company which is ten shares which is to be my daughter Marista share of my estate both real and personal with what she has already received.

In the third place I give and bequeath

unto my two beloved sons H H Harrison and Bradach H Haws the remainder of my real estate to be equally divided between them and all of my personal effects both of horses, hogs, cattle, sheep, mules mousis and household accounts in that may be on hands at my death my said sons paying all of my just debts including a debt due my wife of sixty dollars if it or any other debts are unpaid at my death and each of my sons are to have a good bed, rack with the necessary number of blankets quite comfortable coverings and panns. And they are both of them equally bound to furnish my wife during her life or widowhood the above mentioned maintenance of the products raised on the farm both in quality and kind to render comfortable in sickness or health.

I likewise make and appoint my said two sons H H Harrison and Bradach Haws to be my Executors of this my last will and Testament here by making void and revoking all former wills by me made.
