In the name of God: amen: I Elizabeth Nelson being in declining health and laboring under a severe and painful malady but in my own apprehension and belief and in the full and perfect possession of my mental faculties I do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made at any time I commit my spirit to my merciful Creator, Redeemer, Sanctifier, in hope of a joyful resurrection, I commit my body in Christian burial to the earth in the grave yard near the Cherokee Baptist Church where rests all that was mortal of my beloved husband P. P. Nelson and our little son Judson A. Nelson.

I direct that all my just debts including my funeral expenses be paid by my Executor.

2nd I desire that my Executor have Tomb Stones erected at my grave also to have all the graves enclosed, with iron railings or fencing; the expense of erecting said Tomb Stones and putting up said fence to be paid out of my estate by my Executor.

3rd I devise and bequeath unto the trustees of the Cherokee Baptist Church on Cherokee where I desire to be buried Fifty Dollars to be used in helping to build a new church house for the worship of God said sum to be paid to said trustees by my Executor when the house is commenced to be paid out of the lottery money note.

4th I devise and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Hattie Campbell the note I hold against Prof. R. J. Lusk

5th I devise and bequeath unto my beloved son-in-law John C. Campbell the upper or north west side of the land near Mr. Wellborn with the house and one half the lot containing about three fourths of an acre.

6th I devise and bequeath unto my beloved grand daughter Alice Campbell the lower or south east side of the lot near Mr. Wellborn with the house and one half of the lot containing three fourths of an acre.

7th I devise and bequeath unto my beloved grand child Nelson R. Campbell the house and lot near the job spring on Cherry Street known as the office of my husband I do further will and bequeath unto my beloved grand son Nelson R. Campbell the remainder of the Lewis & Drakins notes after paying for the Tombstones & fencing named in section II of this will also after paying Fifty Dollars to the church as set out in section 3 of this will.

8th I devise and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Hattie Campbell and her husband John C. Campbell equally my interest in Mountain Farm in Carter County except two hundred acres which I will and bequeath equally to my grand children.

Alice and Nelson Campbell, if my Executor sells said land the price of two hundred acres is to go to said children Alice & Nelson my Executor has the right to sell said land whenever he gets a price that he may deem sufficient. This I leave to him altogether to decide. In consideration of the abiding confidence that I entertain for the ability and integrity of my beloved son-in-law John C. Codicil.
