

Mary Eveline Edforth's Will

State of Tennessee I, Mary Eveline Edforth of said County Washington County and state being weak of body but of sound mind and depositing judgment do make this my last will and testament

1<sup>st</sup> I will and bequeath my spirit to Almighty God who gave it and my body to the dust from whence it was taken. 2<sup>nd</sup> I will and bequeath to my children who are now living with me to wit William Edforth Alice Edforth Eliza Edforth Lewis Edforth and Charley Edforth all my house holds and kitchen furniture & all of the live stocks consisting of three heads of hogs one Welsh cow also two wheels one a wool wheel and one Flax wheel

3<sup>rd</sup> I will and bequeath to my children as aforesaid my home stead right in the land on which I now live which is due me under the existing laws pertaining to my homestead acts

4<sup>th</sup> I will to my son Thomas Edforth Sabie Moore formerly Edforth & who intermarried with William Moore. Mary Ann Rutland formerly Edforth who intermarried with Rillard Andrew J Edforth all of whom together with my five first named children are to be made equal in the home stead as due me when Charley my youngest child attains the age of Twenty one years old

5<sup>th</sup> I will and direct that J A Crowley and William Edforth be and act as my executors in carrying out this my last will by Administering my said Estate under said will and laws of the State and that my said executors are not to be required to give bond or security. See testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 16<sup>th</sup> day of March 1879

Anna Hiscox's Will

Oct 7<sup>th</sup> 1879

I Anna Hiscox being of sound mind make my last will and testament in full trust to God who gave it and my body to be decently buried and my funeral expenses to be paid out of my personal effects. Second that my beloved husband shall have all of the real estate during his natural life and when he dies to be buried in like manner as myself. Third that my daughter Elizabeth have possession of the home she now and family live at until after the death of her Father George. It is my will that my grand daughter Hannah Jane Hiscox have the following articles to wit one Bedstead and straw ticks & feather Bed one center fire, 1 quilt 2 pillows and 3 other quilts not finished.

Fifth. It is my will that at the death of my husband the farm be sold to the best advantage and the money equally divided among the lawful heirs of my body.
