I Isaac L Hacker of the County of Washington and State of Tennessee being of sound mind and memory, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and making void all other Wills by me at any time made.

1st I desire that my funeral expenses, and all my just debt be paid as soon as possible after my death -

2nd I desire that my daughter Maria and have one third of all the real estate I may die possessed of, with all the buildings and well, and everything that may fall on ~~one~~ one third of the entire farm, and all the Bedding and Household and Kitchen furniture and all the stock of every kind that I may die seized and possessed of.

3rd I desire that the remaining two thirds of my real estate be equally divided between the five remaining heirs viz - Robert, Alexander, Newton, Maricetta and Catherine, each to have an equal share of said Land -

4th I desire that Melissa Bitner heir at Law by my Daughter Maribha Bitner formerly Maribha Hacker, have one dollar in back out of the proceeds of my estate -
