2nd I desire that my daughter Miss Anna have one third of all the real Estate I may die possessed of, with all the buildings, land, well, and everything that may fall on ~~one~~ one third of the entire farm, and all the bedding and Household and Kitchen furniture and all the blocks of every kind that I may die seized and possessed of.

3rd I desire that the remaining two thirds of my real estate be equally divided between the five remaining heirs viz - Robert Alexander, Dennis, Martha and Catherine, each to have an equal share of said Land.

4th I desire that Misses Bitter heir at law by my Daughter Martha Bitter formerly Martha Hacker, have one dollar and back out of the proceeds of my estate.
