William Jenkins will

I William Jenkins of the County of Washington and State of Tennessee being weak and believing that all men must some die and pass into the presence of an All-wise God whom I trust desire to dispose of what property God hath blessed me with make this as my last will & wit

I direct that the wheat I now have unthreshed in J. H. Grisham's barn being one third be kept by J. H. Grisham and for him to pay my daughter Sarah Carter six bushels out of the same, the balance after leaving enough for my wife to be paid over to my daughter Sarah Carter for her own support. The amount to be set apart by (Abner) Haulko for 12 months. The said year I swear I want sold and the proceeds of the sale appropriated to pay a debt I owe J. A. J. Grisham for which they hold my note with the Court in pledge, and the remainder if any I want paid over to Sarah Carter for support of my wife Eliza Jenkins. I have six head of hogs I want my wife to have for her support. It is my will and desire that all I have in the house such as household furniture be for the use and comfort of my wife so long as she may live and after her death I desire that all said property which may be left or remain shall be the property of my daughter Sarah Carter, my said daughter Sarah will see to and take care of my wife, taking care of the property also, so that she does not want to wish my son now residing I want gathered at the proper time and divided by the load one third of which is mine and out of said sum I want my wife to have her hogs fattened and brought left for her use. The remainder sold and the monies put in interest unless there are some other debts I do not want remembered except a little debt to Susan Crouch and one John Carter. I desire that J. H. Grisham be and he is hereby appointed to see that this my will is carried into effect. Given under my hand this 27th day of July 1882.
