

Susannah Klepper Will

In the name of God Amen,
I Susannah Klepper of Washington County
in the State of Tennessee being in usual health
body and of sound and disposing mind
Memory and understanding Considering
the certainty of death and the uncertainty of
the time thereof and being desirous to settle
my worldly affairs and thereby be the better
prepared to live this world when it shall
please God to call hence do therefore make
and publish this my last will and testament
in manner and form following. That is
to say:

First and principally I commit my
soul into the hands of almighty God and my
body to the earth to be decently buried at the
discretion of my Executor herein after named,
and after my debts and funeral charges
are paid. I devise and bequeath as follows.

1st I give and bequeath unto David P. Klepper
of the County and state before mentioned
the sum of sixteen dollars and sixty six
and two third cents.

2nd I give and bequeath unto Sally an female legal
her birth and name by marriage Martin
supposed to live in County and state aforesaid
the sum of sixteen and two third dollars.

3rd I give and bequeath unto my second daughter
Elizabeth Eve Range now living in California
the sum of sixteen and two third dollars.

4th I give and bequeath unto the heirs of
James Martin Klepper deceased who are
living in the state of Illinois the sum of
sixteen and two third dollars.

5th I give and bequeath unto my third daughter
Rebecca White the widow of Thomas White first
the said Rebecca White living in Sullivan County
of this state the sum of sixteen and two
third dollars.

6th I give and bequeath unto Lucinda Young the
wife Robert Young of Washington County
and State Tennessee the sum of sixteen to
and two third dollars.

7th Owing to the following considerations (to wit)
I being advanced when my eldest children grew
up and became men and women and they
all marrying and settling to their selves
and giving them such outfit as I was
able too and they were made as near equal
as I could well devise until my youngest
son A. J. Klepper came of age at that time my
former improvements such as a dwelling
house born to and the said youngest son
remaining with me and out of his own means
principally building me a good and comfortable
house and born and devoting himself to support
me and made the decline of life easy
and not knowing how long I may still need
his care and attention. I give and bequeath
and leave unto the said youngest son, Andrew
J. Klepper my plantation or farm whereon
I now live being situate on Wallanga river
near the mouth of Burns Creek and joins
the land of Michael Baston, Richard Bragman
and the land of Jo White deceased, Jacob
Donald, John Fulmer, or John Dunn containing
one hundred and fifty acres more or less to
him the said A. J. Klepper and his heirs and assigns
in fee simple.

Item 8th I devise and bequeath for the reasons above
assigned all the residue of my estate both
real and personal to the said youngest
son A. J. Klepper who is to be required to pay
over the sum of one hundred dollars to my
Executor to be hereof ten dollars to be divided
among my other heirs or her to four names
here lately I do hereby constitute and
appoint Jas. P. Dow to be my sole executor

of this my last will and testament, revoking
and counteracting all former wills by me
here to prove made ratifying and confirming
this and none other to be my last will and
testament, In testimony whereof I hereunto
set my hand and affix my seal this the
day of April in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and sixty eight.

Elisha Smith's Will

I Elisha Smith of the County of Washington and State of Tennessee, considering the
uncertainty of life and the certainty of death do I being of sound mind and
memory do make this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all other wills
by me made. After departing my Soul and Spirit to Him who gave it. To
In the name of God amen.

I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife
Nancy Smith a decent Support during her lifetime from the farm on which
I now live; and my will & desire is that my daughter Nannie S.
Smith take care of her mother and see that she does not come to want, as ^{to}
long as she lives, or remains my widow.

I will and bequeath to my daughter Nannie S. Smith
my land where I now live known as the Gamble farm, Containing one
hundred and Thirty three acres be the same more or less, together with
all my personal property at the time of my decease; Consisting of Horses
Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, &c. And Household and Kitchen furniture, and all
farming implements &c &c to the entire amount of my whole personal property, and
nothing shall be construed in this will as to cut her out of any part of
the same. Also I will and bequeath to my daughter Nannie S. Smith Twenty
Eight and one half Acres of land that I bought of Thomas Ford and which
joins the Gamble farm on the East and does now constitute a part of
^{original} my farm. My will is that that my other heirs Caroline Blairs
& Henley Smith do not have none of my property either real or person-
al, I having given them all that I was able to give heretofore.

I will that my daughter Nannie S.
Smith take into her possession at this time, ^{out of the above mentioned} and to take care
of me as a matter of Consideration, so that I am well pro-
vided for during my lifetime.
