I hereby give devise & bequeath a second third part of the said sum then said dollars to the Trustees of the Board of Foreign Missions of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America to be used by them for the common general & general purposes of said Board.

I hereby give devise and bequeath the remaining third part of the said sum in thousand dollars to the Trustees of the Board of Education of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America to be used by them for the common general & general purposes of said last named Board. All of which I give devise & bequeath as above mentioned and in trust for the purposes & intentions of this above my last Will and Testament be fully truly & faithfully carried out I hereby constitute & appoint Stonyfield Mather Esq of the County of Washington Co State of New Jersey or in case he should not be living at my death, George W. Selford of Washington County State of New Jersey to be my Executor & perform the purposes and intentions of this my last Will and Testament.

The above my last Will & Testament is made of my own free Will & is not constrained by any testiment or any one else. First is done with the perfect knowledge and concurrence of my husband, Pittifup Ober of whom I hereunto affix my hand and Seal this third day of August one thousand eight hundred & Sixty six.

Marriage Contract of Alex. Mather & his wife Isabelle.

Whereas Alexander Mather and wife who was formerly Isabella Lee Cheeny at the time and since my marriage did and have agreed that a certain sum of money owned by Mr. Isabelle the wife of the said Alexander Mather should be received by him and the interest thereon made for their natural support and the principal be and remain the property of the said Isabelle his wife entirely subject to the control and management of the said Alex. Mather during his life said money at the time of their marriage was loaned to George Jones & Pittifup W. Dook amounted to near one thousand dollars. That part loaned to George Jones has been paid to & reduction of the said Alexander Mather which in principal and interest amounted to six hundred and eighty dollars. the part loaned to G. W. Dook has not been paid but is still in the hands of the Dr. S. H. Dook now to carry out and fulfill the above agreement the said Alexander Mather agrees that Isabelle his wife Isabelle die before him he binds himself out of his estate to furnish the one thousand thousand dollars to her his wife may will the same and to leave the three fifths he has in his last will and testament devised to her the said sum of one thousand dollars to be disposed of as she may choose and to make up said sum to the thousand dollars the note which the said Alexander Mather holds on the said Dr. S. H. Dook should it be unpaid at the time of their death is to be paid and estimated as part of the same debt up and seal this 8th March 1865
