E. Smith Mathes' Will.

I, E. Smith Mathes of the County of Washington & State
of Tennessee, Do hereby give and bequeath to my son
Mack M. Mathes all of the real estate that I am seized and
possessed of, the same consisting of the Homestead where
I now live including the Bone Mill, the Bricker
lot & the lot of woodland near Thos Cloyds, also
my Carding Machine now in Moors Mill, & further
I give and bequeath to the said Mack M. Mathes my son
debt notes, moneys, apes & debts of whatsoever kind that
I am possessed of or that is due me also my two
work mules Beck & Jack all of my harness, farming
implements, Wagons & Buggy, The old Mare Celina
& her mule colt, I desire sold and the proceeds to be
used by said Mack M. Mathes in paying debts etc. All
of my household & kitchen furniture except my
broken & Library of Books, are to be divided between
my four children, Mack M., Alex P. Riddle, & Adda
M. Mathes, my books to be divided between my three
sons, Mack M., Alex P. & Riddle J. Mathes, my Organ I
give to my son Mack's two daughters, Betsy & Mamie
Mathes. I further bequeath that my son Mack M.
Mathes pay all of my just debts, of whatsoever kind
& further that he pays within two years after my death
to my son Riddle J. Mathes the sum of Three Hundred
Dollars & that he also pays my daughter Adda M.
Mathes Three Hundred Dollars, and further I desire
that he pay to the heirs of Thomas Riddle, if they can be
found the amount due them as per the will of Alexander
Mathes \$10⁰⁰. Also I will that the said Mack M. pays
at the expiration of two years to my grand daughter Effie D.
Mathes & my grand son Frank S. Mathes the sum of Fifty
Dollars each. Also to the Boards of Home & Foreign Missions
of the Old School & Presbyterian Chur each the sum of
Fifty Dollars. Now I, E. Smith Mathes hereby constitute
& appoint my son Mack M. Mathes the executor of this my
last will and testament, In witness whereof I hereunto set
my hand this the 6th day of June 1888
