

Will of John Walter Gees.

I John Walter of the County of Washington and State of Tennessee being of sound mind do make ordain and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking all wills by me at any time previously made.

1st. I direct that all my just debts be paid out of my personal property.

2nd. I will and bequeath to my wife Margaret and my children after my just debts are paid so long as my wife bears my name and remains my widow all my personal property but if my wife should marry then and in that case she shall have nothing out of my Estate nor nothing to do with my property.

3rd. I direct that as I have previously made my children who are now of age equal and desire to conform to this same usage with my, or in regard, to my two minor children who are still living with me, George and Sarah.

4th. I direct that my Executor shall on George's arrival at 21 years of age make him a good & sufficient title of all the land I now possess being about one hundred & sixteen acres more or less - with four hundred dollars in property.

5th. I direct that my Executor pay in fair funds to my daughter Sarah Eight hundred dollars and property to the amount of four hundred dollars on her arrival at 21 years of age.

6th. When the above is complied with, I consider that all my children have reciev'd an Equal share of my property.

7th. I reserve a portion of my house with buildings firewood &c. sufficient for the comfortable accommodation of myself and wife during her natural life or widowhood.

8th. I direct my Executor at the decease of my wife and after all just debts are fully paid to make a publick sale of all the personal property then remaining and if there should be any cash on hand or due my Estate, the same to be collected, calculated and to be equally divided between all my children.

9th. I do hereby nominate and appoint my two sons John P. Walters and Isaac Walter my Executors of this my last will and Testament Nov 22nd 1860 from under my hand.

Rhea both of the County of Sullivan & State aforesaid to administer on my Estate & no security shall be required of them, investing them with plenary power to make such disposition & partition of all my Effects real & personal among my creditors and heirs as in their judgement may appear just and equitable.
