

Henry Sliger Will

I Henry Sliger being weak in body but of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament
1st It is my will that my Executors to be hereinafter named shall pay my Doctors bill and funeral expenses and any other debts I may owe out of the first money that may come into his hands and for that purpose shall proceed as soon as possible to collect all notes and accounts due me.

2nd I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Catherine Sliger the balance of my Estate both real and personal of every description to be used and controlled by her during her life time as she may see fit and at her death it is my wish that my Estate be divided equally between my children except that my Executor shall charge my son H M Sliger with \$100⁰⁰ being the amount advanced him by me in the purchase of horses.

3rd In the event that my real Estate cannot be equally divided between my children then it is my will that my lands be sold by my Executor at public sale to the highest bidder on a credit of twelve months or upon longer time if he thinks it to the interest of my heirs so to do. 4th I nominate and appoint my friend Samuel Replinger my Executor of this my last will &c

That is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it, and my Body I Recommend to the earth to be interred in Decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executor nothing doubting But at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again By the mighty powers of God. And as to owning such worldly estate, whereunto it has pleased God to bless me with in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and Form. I give and Bequeath to all my children an equal share of my land and personal Property

At my Decence hereunto in the following named heirs. James I Cox Saml. Maury Martin Charles Cox George B Cox William H Cox Isaac L Cox John W Cox Mary Jane Hite

I likewise Make and ordain my Beloved son Charles Cox my lawful Executor after all my just debts and funeral expenses. And said I want my lawful Executor to see to all this.

First I give and Bequeath to my beloved son John W Cox my land valued at one thousand dollars By Jesse Manning his mother during her natural life in a gentle Decent manner.

Second. I do not want James I Cox and Charles Cox to be Purched to Land for five years And I want Jesse Martin to have five years also to settle up with the rest of the heirs.

I want my carpenter tools sold to the highest bidder And and the Balance of the farming tools to Jesse also one horse to Jesse Martin. Also our cow to be sold with the tools.

I want Jesse Martin to have one bed so that he will be equal with the rest of the heirs.

I want my lawful Executor to settle with all the heirs and cancel the interest if there is any and deduct from that that's had more than their equal share
