I Elisha Smith of the County of Washington and State of Tennessee, considering the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death and being of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills by me made. After commending my soul and spirit to God who governeth in the name of God amen.

1st I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Nancy Smith a desired support during her life time from the farm on which I now live, and my will & desire is that my daughter Fannie S. Smith take care of her mother and see that she does not come to want as long as she lives or remains my widow.

2nd I will and bequeath to my daughter Fannie S. Smith all my land where I now live known as the Gamble farm, containing one hundred and thirty three acres be the same more or less, together with all my personal property at the time of my decease, consisting of Horses, Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, &c. and household and kitchen furniture, and all farming implements &c &c to the entire use of my whole personal property, and nothing shall be construed in this will as to cut her out of any part of the same. And I will and bequeath to my daughter Fannie S. Smith twenty eight and one half acres of land that I bought of Thomas Ford, and which joins the Gamble farm on the East and does now constitute a part of my ^{original} farm. My will is that that my other heirs Caroline Blevins & Ganley Smith do not have none of my property either real or personal, I having given them all that I was able to give heretofore.

I will that my daughter Fannie S. Smith take into her possession at this time ^{free of the above named property} and to take care of me as a matter of Consideration, so that I am well provided for during my lifetime.

Petition of Hannah C. Anderson

To the Worshipful County Court of Washington County, Your petitioner Hannah C. Anderson respectfully represents that Samuel Anderson was last an inhabitant of this County and departed this life in the month of 1849 leaving this a last will and testament and by said last will and testament appointing John R. Fair his sole executor, who was duly qualified and proceeded to act as the Executor of the Estate of the said Samuel Anderson Decd until he the said John R. Fair departed this life in this County of Washington on the day of 1861 leaving unsettled and unadministered upon in this County of Washington a large portion of the estate of the said Samuel Anderson Decd, and that your petitioner is the widow of the said Samuel Anderson Decd and a resident of the County of Washington and is ready to give bond and sufficient security as required by law, and your petitioner further sheweth unto your Worship that the last will and testament of Samuel Anderson Decd was destroyed by fire with all the originals and copies thereto pertaining and to supply the said will your petitioner sheweth unto your Worship as near the original as can be remembered by persons who saw and read the said will and who say they remember the contents distinctly and the supplied copy offered by your petitioner is in substance and form substantially the same as the original and the only heirs at law of the said Samuel Anderson Decd, all of whom are of lawful age to act for themselves agree that the annexed and supplied copy shall be to all intents and purposes be the same as the original will of the said Samuel Anderson Decd, wherefore she prays that your Worship will grant her letters of administration, or some new such testament annexed of the said deceased.

This the 7th day of February 1870.
