### XV

My will and desire is that my executors make no publice sale of my personal property after my death but that those to whom it belongs under this will divide it among them

### XVI

My will and desire is that if any of my heirs should be dissatisfied and go to law about the will or about what I have given them that they forfeit their interest in my estate to the others heirs and that they receive nothing from my estate.

### XVII

In consideration of the abiding confidence that I entertain for the ability and integrity of my beloved sons John W. Swadley and David C. Swadley I therefore nominate and appoint them my executors to execute and carry out the provisions of this my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I hereunto subscribe

Beginning at a Post Oak tree West 14 1/2 poles to a cedar tree in Rauges line, thence S. 22° West 56 poles to a planted rock, thence East 14 1/2 poles to a planted rock, thence North 22° East 56 poles to beginning, and I direct that my said executor sell said house and land at private or public sale as may be deemed best by my said executor and that the proceeds of the sale of said house and land be equally divided among my three children, Mary Elizabeth Clemans, George Washington Ford and William A. Ford. And it is my will that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid out of my estate by my executor as soon after my decease as shall by him be found convenient. Lastly, I do nominate and appoint W. D. Poreh to be the executor of this my last will and testament.
