I Andrew Walker considering the uncertainty of life & the certainty of death & being in a sound State of Mind & in possession of my reasoning Powers, do on this the 8th day of May one thousand eight hundred & sixty nine make this my last Will & Testament.

First, I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah Walker all of my Household & Kitchen Furniture except the old time piece which I give to my son Henry to remain at the old homestead. I further give & bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah Walker my Black mare. I give and bequeath to my oldest son John B Walker all the money and property he has received of me up to this day. I also give and bequeath to my second son Wm Walker all the money & property he has received of me up to this date. I furthermore give & bequeath to my third son Zachariah Walker my lower farm on which he now resides binding him to pay to Nancy Ann Keys my oldest daughter five hundred with interest from the day that this will goeth into effect on till paid. The payments to be made by yearly installments \$100. per year. The above named three hundred dollars. I give and bequeath to my oldest daughter Nancy Ann Keys. I also bind my third son Zachariah Walker to pay to my second daughter Susannah Jones \$100. one hundred dollars. The above named \$100. I give and bequeath to my second daughter Susannah Jones. I also bind my third son Zachariah Walker to pay to my second son Wm Walker \$50. fifty dollars within two years, no interest. The above \$50. I give and bequeath to my second son Wm Walker.

I give and bequeath to my fourth son Henry Walker my home stead or the farm on which I now live, binding him to support & keep my beloved wife Sarah Walker during her natural life. Also to pay my second daughter Susannah Jones \$400. four hundred dollars by yearly installments \$100. per year, bearing interest from the time this will goeth into effect. The above named \$400. I give and bequeath to my second daughter Susannah Jones. Also to pay to Wm Walker my second son \$50. fifty dollars within two years, no interest. The above named fifty ^{dollars} I give and bequeath to my second son Wm Walker. I also Will that all the debts coming to me be collected & my debts all that I ow be paid out of the same. The remainder with all my property which is not named or specified divide equally between my six children so all of which I hereby set my hand & seal May 8th 1869.

Graham to get a horse bridle and saddle a piece worth one hundred and twenty five dollars each, if not they are to have
