

Will of John Winkle Sen;

Know all men that I John Winkle
State of Tennessee, Son of said County and State being
Washington County, sensible of the solemn charge
from Life to death Appointed for all living by the mercy
of God. Still enjoying the full exercise of my mind and
reason, do on this 11th Day of February one thousand eight
hundred and sixty one ordain and declare this instrument
to be my last Will and Testament as specified under the
following heads, 1st to the Gracious Lord, my Creator
viz, 1st to the Gracious Lord my Creator I in humble
confidence of his Mercy dedicate my Spirit and give
it and who graciously will raise it again unto eternal
at the last day.

2nd to the 11 heirs of Jacob Winkle sen. are due them
yet Seventy Seven dollars and fifty Cents the balance
on their Fathers part of the Estate.

3rd to my Daughter Mary Winkle I do give and bequeath
two bedsteads and bedding for the same and all bed clothing
and close which she has made also one bureau, one
chest dishes knives and forks and kitchen furniture
in full number as her other Sister received one cupboard
and any of the dishes in it, one Choe of Table, one
Choe of bed, one little one Washing tub one looking glass
five Shovel and daggers, one Side Saddle and bridle
one Choe of Horses and one Cow, flat iron, pair
of Steel Yards, six Chains, and four pair Choe of Sheep
four do. of bea. Stands, one little and one big wheel one
eel one topm gear, Skein quill Wheel and big Spool Shuttles
and others for Weaving. I also will and bequeath to her one
hundred Dollars.

4th to my Daughter Elizabeth Wilson I will and bequeath
one hundred dollars, which sum she has already ~~got~~
in full, 5th to my Son John Winkle I will and bequeath
one hundred dollars, which amount is now already paid
to him in full, 6th to my Son Mary Winkle I will and
bequeath to him one hundred dollars for which amount
he is paid over in full, 7th to my Son Joseph Winkle
I will and bequeath one hundred dollars which amt is
paid to him in full, 8th to my daughter Sally Whiston
I will and bequeath one hundred dollars which amt is
already paid in full,

9th to my Son Philip Winkle I will and bequeath to him my home
plantation on which I now Live do as not to interfere with the part
I sold Abraham and also an Entry which I now hold also on New
Nogon which is here now, with bed Wagon Cover feed trough stratching
tal bucket and a full set of harness for four horses with bridle and halter
Chain, one big plow and double tree and single tree and Wreath
one bull lung and Shovel plow 1 Mattock and 2 hoes 1 sprouting hoe 4 hog
heads 1 Windmill dam, Lock and Tackles 1 Grindstone

on the part of Philip Winkle my Son that after my death
Mary he is to let my Daughter Mary to have and hold or
so much as necessary for her to in the house during her
natural lifetime with a portion of the Land attached to it for
her use and that my Son Philip is to maintain Mary
decently during her lifetime do as to live in comfort and also
to pay unto her besides three dollars annually and then he is
to have the Management of the farm as specified Provided he
complys with the above if not the place is to stand good for
her Support: as in former will, 10th to my Son Abraham Winkle
I will and bequeath to him one hundred dollars which amt
is paid over to him in full, 11th My desire and wish is that
after my death that all my Debt be Satisfied first
then afterwards all my personal property and estate not expressed
above is to be Sold and equally Divided amongst the heirs
my desire and wish is for all my Children to be Satisfied with
the above as expressed 12th I do hereby name and constitute
Henry E. Pulla to be my Executor 13th finally I hereby declare
this instrument to be my last Will and Testament done this
day and date above written in witness whereoff I have set
my hand and Seal.
