Joseph Woolf Will.

I now all men by these presents that I Joseph Woolf of the County of Washington and State of Tenn. do make and ordain this my last will and testament and all former wills and testaments. My will and desire is that my nephew John S. Woolf and Samuel C. Kraw (that married my niece formerly Margaret Woolf) be my Executors to execute my will.

After all my lawful debts and funeral expenses are paid then the balance of my property and real estate is to be divided as follows.

1st My will and desire is that John S. Woolf's two children Mauricia Elizabeth and Joseph John Union and their heirs shall have all my End Land and Rail Road Stock Eight shares, and Seven Hundred Dollars of my best notes of land and all the interest that has accumulated thereon.

2nd My will and desire is that Ellis Kraw and Elizabeth Kraw Daughters of Samuel C. Kraw and Margaret his wife and their heirs shall have the old Farm on which I now live.

3rd My will and desire is that Eliza Saylor Daughter of Perry Saylor shall have ^{her} choice of my best horses.

4th My will and desire is that Martha Kraw widow of Margaret and Samuel C. Kraw's son that died shall have the next choice of my horses.

5th My will and desire is that David Saylor and his wife Hannah shall have all my Farming utensils with the gears and waggons and all the household and kitchen furniture with my bed. (I except two chests and two tables) Provide David Saylor + Hannah his wife stays with me until my death, if they do not stay with me until that time then the said property is to Revert back to my Estate.

6th My will and desire is that the balance of my notes and interest and my Cows Hogs + cattle and the two excepted chests and tables heretofore named and all the balance of my Property if there be any.

P. Nelson and our little son Judson B. Nelson.

I direct that all my just debts including my funeral expenses be paid by my Executor.

2nd I devise that my Executor have Tombstones erected at my grave also to have all the graves inclosed, with iron railings or fencing; the expense of erecting said Tombstones and putting up said fence to be paid out of my estate by my Executor.

3rd I devise and bequeath unto the trustees of the Cherokee Baptist Church on Cherokee where I desire to be buried Fifty Dollars to be used in helping to build a new Church house for the worship of God said amt. to be paid to said trustees by my Executor when the house is commenced to be paid out of the balance Jones note.

4th I devise and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Harrie Campbell the note I hold against Prof. R. J. Luck.

5th I devise and bequeath unto my beloved son-in-law John B. Campbell the upper or north west side of the land near Mr. Wellborn with the house and one half the lot containing about three fourths of an acre.

6th I devise and bequeath unto my beloved grand daughter Alice Campbell the lower or south east side of the lot near Mr. Wellborn with the house and one half of the lot containing three fourths of an acre.

7th I devise and bequeath unto my beloved grand child Nelson A. Campbell the house and lot near the Job's spring on Cherry Street known as the office of my husband. I do further will and bequeath unto my beloved grand son Nelson C. Campbell the remainder of the Jones & Drake notes after paying for the Tombstones & fencing named in section II of this will also after paying Fifty Dollars to the Church as set out in section 3 of this will.

8th I devise and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Harrie Campbell and her husband John B. Campbell equally my interest in Mountain Farm in Carter County except two hundred acres which I will and bequeath equally to my grand children
