In the Name of God Amen This fourth day of January in the year of
Our Lord Christ One thousand seven hundred and eighty four Baptist McComb
of the County of Washington and State of North Carolina being sick & weak in body
but of perfect mind and memory calling to mind the mortality of this my State
and that it is appointed for all men Once to die do make and Order this to be
my last will and testament that is to say principally and first of all I commend
my Soul to God who gave it and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent &
christian manner at the direction of my executors and further such worldly
goods whereunto it pleased God to bless me with I give and dispose of in manner as
followeth First of all I Order and it is my will that all my Last & lawful debts
and funeral charges be paid of by my executors — I do give and bequeath unto my
daughter Elizabeth McComb my best mare and colts and bed and furniture one cow
and calf such as now got two more her choice of the Stock at my demise & all
and every part of my household furniture — I do likewise Order that my executors
make a writ to the tract of land that I gave to my Son John McComb & likewise
to that tract I gave my Son David McComb, the other parts where I now live on I do
give unto my Son Jonathan McComb and his heirs with its improvements upon condition
that it be valued by three indifferent persons to be chosen by the legates he having two
legates parts the other parts to be paid in manner following In one year after my
decease that is to say to Wm McComb John McComb David McComb & Isabella McComb
and in case that he should refuse to take said land on those conditions that it be

sold and the money arising therefrom be divided amongst the legates in manner
aforesaid — And that all the stock and moveables not otherwise divided be sold,
and equally divided between amongst the legates and in case Isabella McNabb
should die in her non age that her part should be divided the other legates
aforesaid and I do give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary McNabb Margaret
McNabb Jane McNabb and Esther McNabb five shillings to be paid to them one year
after my disease by the other legates — and I constitute my son John McNabb and
David McNabb to be sole executors of this my last will & testament and do hereby
revoked and annulled and make void all other wills and testaments by
me heretofore made and constitute by confirming afterwards this and no other

Thomas Mitchell of the State of North Carolina Washington
being in a low state of health and in some degree of infirmity to preserve the mortality
of his body and knowing that it was appointed for all men once to die do hereby declare that
my last will & testament is giving all I recommend my soul to God who gave it to me
and as to my body I recommend it to the earth to be buried in a Christian like & decent manner
and the execution of my executor is nothing doubting but all the general reservation it shall be
proved again by the mighty power of God and as touching at such worldly estate wherewith I
have pleased God to bless me with in this life I give choice and dispose of the same in the
following manner I do hereby give and bequeath that my last debt be fully paid
and satisfied and of the remaining part of my estate I give and bequeath to my wellbeloved
daughter Margaret Meadows the sum of seven Shillings Sterling I also give and bequeath
to my beloved Son James Mitchell the sum of seven Shillings Sterling - I also give & bequeath
to my beloved daughter Elizabeth Thompson the sum of five Shillings Sterling and after
