# Benjamin Blackburn Will

In the Name of God Amen

August 10<sup>th</sup> in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty six I Benjamin Blackburn of the State of Franklin and County of Washington farmer being very weak and frail in body but in perfect mind and Memory Thanks be given unto God Therefore calling unto mind the Mortality of My body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die I do make constitute and Ordain this My last will & Testament that is to say principally and first of all I recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it me and My body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian like manner at the discretion of My exutors nothing doubting but that at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as to such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I do give bequeath and dispose of it in the following manner & form to wit I do give and bequeath to my dearly and well beloved wife Mary Blackburn good sufficient gentle and handson Maintenance during her life of all Things necessary & likewise on good comfortable house and one good cow to be kept and possessed by her as her own property — Item I do give and bequeath to My beloved son Benjamin my great bible — Item I do ~~do~~ bequeath to each of My grand sons named Benjamin one good school bible — Item I do bequeath to My son John Blackburns son Samuel one good school bible — Item I do give and bequeath to My beloved sons Robert Blackburn & Benjamin Blackburn My bond an Heron Curion of three hundred pounds — Item to my son Archibald Blackburn I do give and bequeath the land whereon I now live only allowing him to pay to my son Samuel Blackburn forty pounds — Item I do give and bequeath to my dearly & well beloved daughter Ann one good bed and bed clothes and hangings and Chest the two other excepted — Item I do give to my dearly and well beloved daughter Elizabeth Bay my negro wench named Wannah

I do give and bequeath to my beloved sons Robert Blackburn & Benjamin Blackburn  
my bond on Kieron Curion of three hundred pounds — Item to my son Archibald Blackburn  
I do give and bequeath the land whereon I now live only allowing him to pay to my son  
Samuel Blackburn forty pounds — Item I do give and bequeath to my dear & well  
beloved daughter Ann one good bed and bed clothes and hangings and chest for the overhead cupboards —  
Item I do give to my dear and well beloved daughter Elizabeth Bay my new work named window  
which shall devolve to her children at her death Likewise I do allow my son Archibald  
Blackburn to give her one good yepher or twenty pound horse only keeping out of that the bond  
which he the said Archibald Blackburn owes to Thomas Bays — Item I do give & bequeath  
to my dear and well beloved son John Blackburn my shoe buckles likewise my great coat and  
cloth coat and serots — Item I do give to my son Robert Blackburn my cotton coat & serots  
Item I do give to my son Archibald my shirt my great pot and my table and whatever is in Alexander  
Mathys hands and other small articles I allow to Archibald to clear my debts — And for executors  
to execute my last will and testament I appoint constable and Antinous my trusty and well beloved  
sons Archibald Blackburn and John Wear as my sole executors and I do hereby utterly disannul  
revoke and make void all and every other former wills and beques by any way made by me  
and I do acknowledge this and none other to be my last will and testament in witness  
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day and year above written  
Signed sealed published and pronounced by the said Benjamin Blackburn as his last will &  
testament in the presence of us the under named
