In the Name of God Amen

I the fourth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety three George Gillespie Senr of the County of Greene and Territory of the United States South of the Ohio being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory Thanks be given unto God Thus far calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men Once to Die do make & Ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principally and first of all I give & bequeath my soul into the hands of God that gave it and for my body I recommend it to the earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent Manner at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God - recommending such worldly estate as here with it hath pleased God to bestow on me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form

Impremis It is my will and Last Will that in the first place all my last debts and funeral charges be paid & satisfied Item I give and bequeath to my well beloved wife Martha during her widowhood One hundred acres of land including the dwelling house wherein I now live and the large field before the barn door and the Orchard and the use of the State known by the name of the Stations State also I bequeath to her during her widowhood my Negro Man Dick I also bequeath to her my Negro woman Elsie to be her during the life of my said wife

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and at her death to give her to any of my children she may desire & that proper I also give
and bequeath to my said wife one bedstead and furniture one chest of drawers my silver man &
my horse called Bob and her own saddle two pots three yokes cow of her own choosing from my stock of
cattle one plough and turtling with horse gear for drawing for two horses I also give her my said wife
twenty pounds cash counting others at ten shillings then I give and bequeath to my well beloved son Thomas
one house to be valued equal to twenty pounds Virginia counts and to his son George if he should live
to arrive at the age of twelve years one horse to the value of fifteen pounds Virginia count —
then I give and bequeath to my well beloved daughter Martha Jack one house to be valued by fifteen pounds
Virginia count and also to her son Gary Jack if he should live to arrive at the age of fifteen years
one horse to the value of fifteen pounds Virginia counts —
then I also give and bequeath to my well beloved daughter Jane whom he lives and a year forever the best
distant I bought of James and Charles Robertson in Green county and the horse bequeath to her two
Negro girls the one named Rachelle the other named Sue & four yokes cow of her own choosing
and my stock of cattle after my wife has chose her three one have bequeathed to her also a
large kettle and pot two beds and furniture two bedsteads also the picture that is now in her possession
I also give and bequeath to her one bond upon Stephen Wynn for one hundred dollars
then I also give and bequeath to my well beloved son John that part of this plantation on
which he now lives running from the lower end on the river as far as the mouth of
big Runions including all that part of this survey that lies on the other side of big Runions
which part I bequeath to him his heirs and assigns for ever I also give & bequeath to him
his heirs and assigns for ever five hundred acres of land that Thomas King owes to me I also
give and bequeath to him one Negro girl now in his possession named Dinah I also give
and bequeath to my son John during his natural life a Negro fellow now in his poss

of fifteen years one horse to the value of fifteen pounds Virginia Count
Then I also give and bequeath to my grandson George Gellishie son of my son John
Gellishie if he should live to arrive at the age of fifteen years one horse to the value
of fifteen pounds Virginia Count - Then I also give & bequeath to my three
well beloved sons George Gellishie Allen Gellishie & James Gellishie their heirs & assigns
for ever all the remainder of my estate of every name and description whatsoever
to be equally divided amongst them share and share alike including the share of the
negro woman named Elsie and also the negro boy named Dick at the end of my wife's
widowhood or at her decease and also the negro boy named Harry at the decease of my
son John it is my will that this includes to be given to my three sons apportioned their
heirs and assigns for ever equally the land and other property given to my wife during
her widowhood or life that it shall revert to them at the end of ~~either~~ also my
will is that all bonds or other debts not herein otherwise given shall be equally
divided to my three sons George Allen & James I consider that the negro woman
Annema is the property of my son George and my will is that he have her exclusively
of his equal division before mentioned Then it is also my will that if a test

of land should be lost or any part thereof that my son Thomas sold that belong to me
 upon back creek that my sons Thomas George Allen & James shall have the lots equally
 among them - I also constitute Beidan and appoint my well beloved wife Martha
 Gillespie executrix and my sons George Gillespie and Allen Gillespie executors of this my
 last will and testament and I do hereby utterly disavow revoke & rescind all &
 every other former wills Testaments legacies and exequutors by me in any way before
 this now named and described & witnessed & confirmed that and no other to be
 my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 and seal the xxvth day of June 1866 -
