I Isaac Denton of the county of Washington Territory of the United States South of the river Ohio being of sound memory blessed be God do this fourth day of July in the year of our Lord one Thousand Seven hundred & Ninety four Make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner and form as following that is to say — First of all I recommend my spirit to almighty God who gave it and my body to be buried in a plain and decent manner as soon as convenient will furnish my funeral expenses and all my last debts to be paid —

Item I give and bequeath unto my two sons Isaac Denton & Jeremiah Denton all my lands to be equally divided between them (is wit) where on now I live to their own proper use that is to say after their Mother's death it is to be equally divided in quantity and in quality. Then it is my desire that my well beloved wife Ann Denton should have my estate in possession during life or widowhood except twenty pounds or sixty six dollars and four shillings for the use of my son Isaac Denton being in form — all the remainder of my estate I give & bequeath unto my wife Ann Denton and Isaac Denton and Jeremiah Martha Agge Elizabeth Denton my five Children to be equally divided among them — Then it is my desire that after my wife's death that Susanna Rice shall have ten pounds worth of the my Estate. I hereby constitute and appoint my worthy friends Ebenezer Whitcomb & David Job executors of this my last will and Testament In witness whereof I the said Isaac Denton have hereunto set my hand and the signed name of
