 being weak in body and sick in health and calling to mind that it is appointed by him
 God for all men once to die I therefore will and bequeath my soul to almighty God
 and my body to be buried in a Christian Manner and decent Manner and my funeral
 Charges to the first friend (and as I have no worldly estate or hath been pleased god
 to bless me with) I do will and bequeath my following (to wch) Item I give and bequeath
 unto my well beloved Sons Abraham & William two Negro Men slaves
 named Peter and Frank also the whole of my land whereon I now live and
 else where that I shall or may happen them I give and bequeath unto my well
 beloved daughter Jane fifty pounds Virginia Money drawn in Cash Item I give
 and bequeath unto my well beloved daughter Mary her self that Negro Woman slave named
 Charles Item I give and bequeath unto my two and well beloved daughters Jane &
 Agnes all my Stock and Movable Estate to be equally divided between them
 Item I give and bequeath unto my dear and well beloved Sons and daughters
 that where as they dear and well beloved Father die will and bequeath unto my
 son William his son and as I have given yet Abraham & son unto the said Slaves or
 any part thereof but in case the said slaves should come to me dead that the
 same may be equally divided between the whole of my Sons and daughters and
 I do hereby appoint Deacon and Constable my trusty and well beloved friends
 Abraham Cox and William Cox and John Jones to be my true and lawful
 executors and to have by descent and renounce all former gifts or

else where that I shall or may ship Item I give & bequeath unto my well
beloved daughter Jane fifty pounds Virginia Money Due in Cash Item I give
and bequeath unto my well beloved daughter Lydia that Negro Woman knowne
Charles Item I give and bequeath unto my two and well beloved daughters Jane &
Lydia all my Stock and Movable Estate to be equally divided between them
Item I give and bequeath unto my dear and well beloved Sons and Daughters
that wher as my dear and well beloved Father did will and bequeath unto me
some Negro Slaves and as I have never yet distributed the said Slaves or
any part thereof but in case the said Slaves shoule con be recovered that they
same may be equally divided between the whole of my Sons and Daughters and
I do hereby appoint Deacon and Constable my trusty and well beloved friends
Abraham Cox and William Cox and John Carter to be my true and lawfull
executors and to hereby discharge and remoue all former gifts or
legacies made or left by any former wills by made In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 19th day of
October in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and
seventy seven 1777
