

John Potters Will

In the Name of God Amen

The eighteenth day of November in the year of Our Lord one thousand
one hundred and eighty nine John Potter of the County of Washington in the State of North Carolina being
in his body but of sound mind and Memory hereunto bequeath to god for his mercy but willing to record his
reality of my body and knowing that it is appointed once for all men to die do make constate & ordain
my last will and testament in the following manner and form —

First I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my body to the Ground
to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors to be hereafter named testifying
doubting but to receive it again at the general resurrection at the last day and a touching such worldly
estate as it please God to bless me with in his life I demise bequeath and dispose of in the following manner
and form —

First I name all debts due from my wife Anna Potters which she may be lawfully
juste and bequeath unto my second wife Elizabeth Potter the plantation wherein I now live
surviving her Natural life also her money and tarey goods in money stock and household furniture
and other her Due care I will and bequeath the same land lying on the side of the creek I have an acre
belonging to John Potter and Thornton Potter to be equally divided between them & their heirs
for ever —

I also will and bequeath unto my beloved son in law Sodam Kembell all the land laying
on the east side of stream creek on my Survey including the place where George Potter now lives to him
and his heirs for ever — I also will and bequeath unto my beloved son Abraham Potter One cow
and a touching the remainder part of my estate which consists of cattle horses hogs sheep household
furniture tools book debts bonds notes negroes her chattels &c. I will bequeath and equally divide
the same collected or received from the persons where the same is due unto my beloved children as
following that is to say Mary Potter John Potter Elizabeth Potter Johnson Potter Sarah Potter &

be divided between John Potter and Johnston Potter to be equally divided between them & their heirs
for ever - I also will and bequeath unto my beloved son in law Adam Raabolt all the land laying
on the east side of Rivers crake in my Survey including the place where George Moller now lives to him
and his heirs for ever - I also will and bequeath unto my beloved son Nathaniel Potter One Cow
and a boarhing the remainder part of my estate which consists of cattle houses ~~the~~^{the} sheep houses
furniture tools book debts bonds notes money hereditaments &c. I will bequeath and equally divide
when collected or received from the persons where the same is due unto my beloved Children as
followeth that is to say Nancy Potter John Potter Elizabeth Potter Johnson Potter Sarah Potter &
in case my said son in law Adam Raabolt should los the land herein described he is to have
his equal tract with last - the five last mentioned Children Nancy Potter John Potter Elizabeth
Potter Johnson Potter and Sarah Potter - I do furthermore by these presents make constitute
and ordain Hannah Potter my beloved wife and my trusty and well beloved friends Cornelius
Bowman and Thomas Whetton my sole executors to this my last will and testament and I
do by these presents revoke desanull and disallow all former wills legacies & bequests by me
made ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament. In
testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day & date above written
signed sealed and delivered by the said
