part of all my household furniture & Stock during her surviving my widow and the use of my
dwelling plantation while my Younger son comes of lawfull age then my wife & desire is that
the land shall be sold & the money equally divided amongst the boys that may be alive at
that time and that the remaining two thirds of my household & Stock be equally divided
between my daughters to be given to them as they may come to lawfull age or get married &
my wife and desire is that at the death of my surviving wife that the
third of my moveable property by this will given to her during her life or widowhood
be equally divided between my daughters. And I do nominate and appoint
my said wife to be the executrix of this my testament & last will hereby
revoking & disanulling all former testaments wills legacies & executors by me
heretofore made and do make and publish this sheet of paper to be & contain
my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my

Ninety six.
