

Michael Hider Will

 Washington County & In the name of God Amen This twenty eighth day of May 1790
 I Michael Hider of county aforesaid being very sick & weak in body but of perfect mind and
 memory thanks be to God therefore calling unto mind the Mortality of my body and knowing
 that it is appointed for all men to die do make and bequeath this my last will & testament
 that is to say principally & first of all I give & bequeath my soul into the hands of
 almighty God that gave it and my body I commend to the earth to be buried at the discretion
 of my exors & as touching such worldly estate whereunto it has pleased God to
 bless me in this life I give and dispose of the same in the following manner & form -
 First I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Hider, the plantation whereon I now live
 on together with all the houses & buildings and all appurtenances belonging to the same tract of land
 on the same side of the river or branch to be by her fully & fully possessed and enjoyed
 during her natural life and her decease to descend to my son Jonathan Hider. I also
 give to my beloved wife Elizabeth all & singular the stock of horses & cattle belonging to
 the above plantation also all the sheep and hogs & growing wheat also all the
 beds & furniture & household furniture - Then I give to my son John Hider the tract
 of land known by the name of Kites on the other side of the branch supposed to be two
 hundred acres together with the plantation and all the appurtenances thereto belonging
 Then I give to my son Michael Hider the land & plantation known by the name
 Snellums one hundred acres whereof was bought of Mathew Talbot Sr. & the
 other part of said land is divided by a line between John & Michael supposed to
 contain one hundred and fifty acres in all with all the appurtenances thereto

of land known by the name of Kites on the other side of the bank supposed to be two
hundred acres together with the plantation and all the appurtenances thereto belonging
them. I give to my son Michael Hiden the land & plantation known by the name
Knellum one hundred acres whereof was bought of Mathew Talbot Esq. & the
other part of said land is divided by a line between John & Michael supposed to
contain one hundred and fifty acres in all with all the appurtenances thereto
belonging - I give to my other son ~~John~~ Adam Hiden no land all my stock of horses
cattle hogs and sheep together with the household furniture to be equally divided
among them at my wife's decease namely Adam Hiden Jacob Hiden & Joseph Hiden
I also constitute make and ordain my beloved wife Elizabeth Hiden executrix together
with my son John Hiden executor of this my last will and testament and I do
hereby utterly disallow revoke & disannul all other wills & testaments by me
made ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will & testament.
