

In the name of God Amen. May 12th 1779 Rebecca Vandusport being
in low state of body but of sound mind and memory blessed be god do make this
my last will and Testaments that is to say principally and first of all I give
and bequeath my soul unto god that gave it and my body to the earth to be
buried in a Christian and decent like manner at the discretion of my exutors
after name nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same
again by the mighty power of God - and as touching such worldly goods whereunto
it hath pleased god to bless me in this life. I give devise and bequeath thus
in the following manner (to wit) I give and bequeath unto Peter Nave the husband
of my daughter Ann six head of neat cattle of different makes the stock make
being a swallow fork in the left ear and I also give to the aforesaid Peter Nave
the rest of my estate consisting in one Mare of a Mouse color brand
two Oxen Thunders and thy of left side and 2 pots pan fire long 2 sets of
Cough Irons two pewter dishes three plates and one basin of the same and
two or three bliny plates some small books with a quantity of Money in
hands of Abraham Vandusport my son and I further constitute & appoint
aforesaid Peter Nave my executor to this my last will and Testaments
witness whereof hereby sign seal publish pronounce and declare the
same in presence of us
Rebecca ^{her} Vandusport. (Seal)
