In the Name of God Amen

March Nineteenth One Thousand Seven hundred & Ninety two

Thomas Bell of the County of Washington and western territories south of the Ohio being weak in body yet of a sound & perfect understanding doth be to god for his Mercy to me last calling to mind the Mortality of my body & knowes that it is appointed for all men once to die I make & Ordain this my last will & Testament that is to say principally & first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it & as for my body I command it to the earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent Manner at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the almighty power of god and as touching such worldly estate whatsoever it hath pleased god to bless me with in his life I desire a good & bequeath to each of the sons in the following manner & term It is my will and I do ordain that in the first place all my just debts & funeral charges be settled and paid - In witness I do bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth the black Mare named Fly & her saddle & bridle with the bed Fly lies on & all its furniture and the dozen & all its furniture and her maintenance of the land whereth she remains a widow providing the said land to live on it if not a well and sufficient widow that it be sold & the property laid out for other land & her to have her maintenance of that land & one cow with a white face Cherry by name.

Item I will and desire that the land be equally divided between my two sons John & David and providing the said land is more preferable to the other he is to pay the other until he is equal with him & given to John the bay mare and my white Goat & he is to school David & Mary David is to be taught to the single rule of three Mary to read god word distinctly as for my daughter Sarah I desire that she have the hoger Calf we gave in our labor her self

and for maintenance of the land which she remains a widow providing the law cause so live on it
if not I will and prohiclete Order that it be sold & the property land out for other lands & her
to have her Maintenance of that land & one cow with a white face Cherry by Name.—
Item I will and Order that the land be equally divided between my two sons John & David
and providing the same, are as preferable to the Other he is to pay the Other until he is equal
with him & give to John the bay Mare and my little gun & he is to school David & Mary
David is to be taught to the single rule of three Mary is to have good and decently, a, for my
daughter Sarah I Order that she have the hysper Calf we I gave in her & above the rest
And as to my other property (viz) horses cows sheep and hogs with my house hold furniture I
will & prohiclete Order that they be prased & equally divided among all my children and
providing this come not up to the land I prohiclete Order that the two boys pay to my daughters
entire all have alike as, for none of my children get unlearmed I prohiclete Order that
they be taught to read distinctly & it to be paid out of the whole in my estate at the discretion
of my executors & providing that it may please God to call any ~~of~~ these my Children out
of time and eternally before they come to years to dispose of their share it is to be equally divided
among the rest.— Item I Order that my beloved wife Elizabeth & Mr. & Mrs. William Bell be
executors of this my last will & testaments & Brother John Bell Guardian
of Test.
