Abstract of Old Accounts

John Hunley, died about 1797, and was insolvent.

1795 - 1797 Estate of John Hunley.

1. This account was made out by Dufty Jacobs, administrator of John Hunley, James Gordon and Samuel Wood, justices, were appointed by Washington, Co. to appraise account and examine Jacobs records. They report the estate of John Hunley insolvent on August 8, 1799.
