Know all men by these presents that I George Lumpkin now of Watauga formerly of Pittsylvania County, Virginia have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto William Been Senior of Watauga aforesaid for an in Consideration of the sum of one hundred + seventy three pounds fourteen shillings + one penny Current Money of Virginia by the said Been Advanced for the use of me the said Lumpkin to satisfy a debt due from him to a certain James Buchanan of Augusta County (if the said debt be of the Amount aforesaid) my negroes following to wit Jo a fellow of about twenty one years old + Dinah about twenty two To have + to hold unto the said William Been his heirs + assigns forever with warranty to the said Been his heirs and assigns against me the said Lumpkin my heirs + assigns forever.

Witness my hand + seal this sixteenth day of October one thousand and seven hundred + seventy three
