I William Noddy Esq. being in a low state of health though sound
in mind and memory and calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing it is appointed
unto all men once to die I do make and declare this my last will and testament in writing that
is to say as follows. And first I do commend my soul into the hand of God who first
gave it and my body to the ground from whence it came to be buried in decency at the
discretion of my executors hereafter named in expectation of recovering the same again at the
resurrection by the mighty power of God. and as for such worldly goods as the Lord has been
pleased to bestow on me in this life. I do give bequeath and dispose of in the following
manner and first I will that all my lawful debts be paid out of my moveable property

I do give and bequeath unto my Nephew Charles McGray whom I do take whereby as my lawful heir eight pounds sterling to be paid him in property. Then I do give and bequeath unto my beloved Sister Elizabeth Calvert One Negro fellow named Adam and at my Sister Elizabeth Deane the said Adam to go to one of her Children which he shall chose first on paying the rest of his Brother as before an equal share among the other Children likewise I do give and bequeath to my Nephew Charles McGray and John Calvert two hundred acres of land lying on Camp Creek to be equally divided between them if my Father William Noddy shall at any time die for the same if not it is void. Then I do give and bequeath unto my beloved Sister Sarah McGray Mary Bayles and Ellenor Hill and my deceased Sister Abis Browns Children all the rest of my lands & moveables except the Mill Lot on the land where my Brother John Noddy formerly did live and his acres of land being it for the use of the mill and such other things as I shall think fit to dispose of hereafter the rest as above to be equally divided into four equal parts and at the decease of any of my Sisters their part to be equally divided amongst their own Children my deceased Sister Abis Brown Children having an equal part with my living Sisters. I do make Ordain & constitute Daniel McGray and William Calvert to be my Executors of this my last will & testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 15th day of September in the year of Our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and Ninety Two
