

William Whitson Will.

In the name of God Amen

The 16th day of October in the year of Our Lord 1783

I William Whitson of the County of Wainwright and State of North Carolina being sick in body but of good and sound memory thanks be to almighty God and calling to mind the uncertain estate of this transitory life and that all flesh must yield to death when it shall please God to call so make constitute Ordain and declare this my last will & testament in manner & form following writing & declaration by these presents all and every testaments or testaments will or wills heretofore by me made and declared either by word or writing and this is to be taken only for my last will and testament and none other, and first I give & bequeath my soul unto almighty God and my body to the earth to be buried in a plain & decent manner when it shall please my executors hereafter named to perform

And now for settling of my temporal estate and such goods Chattels and debts as it hath pleased God give above my debts to bestow upon me I do Over give dispose the same in manner and form following that is to say first I will that all my last debts which I owe to any person or persons whatsoever be truly paid wth their convenient times after my decease by my executors hereafter named - Then I give and bequeath unto my son Ephraim Whitson all my estate real and personal but with this exception should my Negro Women hereafter have children - Then I give & bequeath unto my daughter Savannah Egan the first born of either of the said Worsley Children that shall live to be two years old. I also give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Egan the first born of either of the said

And now for settling of my Temporal estate and such goods Chattels and
debts as it hath pleased God give above my debts to be paid upon me I do
Order give dispose the same in manner and form following that is to say first
I will that all my last debts which I owe to any person or persons whatsoever
be truly paid within convenient time after my decease by my exors
hereafter named - Item I give and bequeath unto my son Joseph Whitson
all my estate real and personal but with this exception should my
Negro women hereafter have children - Item I give & bequeath
unto my daughter Susannah Egan the first born of either of the said
working Children that shall live to be two years old. I also give and
bequeath unto my daughter Lydia M'Key the second that shall live to
the same age. Item I do appoint my sons Joseph Whitson and Joseph
Whitson to be exors of this my last will and testament in writing
whereof I have hereunto set my hand the 24th of October above written
signed by the said William Whitson as his last will & testament in the
