

I now concur in the bequests my debts be equally divided between my wife and my daughter Artilia Chast. And at the death of my wife Louisa E. Chast, I then give said tracts of Land & Maitling 314 acres adjacent the town of Carrollville Pennsylvania and the Negroes namely Agnes Edmund William Joshua Colle and Frederick to my Daughter Elizabeth A. Doherty to go to her with the ^{40th} portion Lots in said Town of Carrollville Pennsylvania.

Thirdly, I give and bequeath to the sole and separate use of my daughter Mary A. Simmons to the heirs of her Body the following property, the Negro Woman Jane, and Shadrach, my Daughter Nancy A. Simmons etc leaving no child, or children, or the sum of such child or children surviving her, then I give said woman Jane and her in excess to my Daughter Elizabeth A. Doherty.

Fourthly, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Artilia Chast for and during her Natural life the following named and described property to wit, A tract or parcel of Land in Wayne County Pennsylvania on Beach Creek known as my Beach Creek farm or Land, Containing 364 acres more or less and my Equity of purchase in the Lands of David Green adjacent the said Beach Creek Land, which was sold by virtue of a deed of trust made by said David Green to one Hugh Faraldo for my Benefit etc and one other tract of Land situated in Decatur County Indiana in the Carrollville Bend of the Indiana River adjoining the lands of the heirs of James Makem and Samuel Cade Containing 148 acres More or less known as the Bragel Lands, and the following Negroes, Neg. Woman Rachel and her two Children Easter and Mary the first Frances and the other Samuel, and at the death of my Daughter Artilia Chast I then give and bequeath said Beach Creek Land of 364 acres and the Equity of purchase in the Lands of David Green adjacent said 364 acres of Land in said Wayne County And said tract of 148 acres in said Decatur County Pennsylvania described as the Bragel Lands, And Negroes Rachel, Easter, Easter Mary, Frances and Samuel to my Daughter Elizabeth A. Doherty.

Fifthly, I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth A. Doherty, the following named and described property viz, Negro man Randolph Mann Maitland and his Children Anna Colle, Anna and Susan, and two Boys named ~~Randall~~ George and three Tracts of Land in Wayne County Pennsylvania, one tract of 175 acres near said Town of Carrollville Deeded to me by the James Doherty, adjacent the Lands of Bennett Hale - one tract for \$684 acres near said Town of Carrollville in Wayne County, Deeded to me by the State of Pennsylvania by Grant No. 29553.

which in Bonds and Cash about \$50000. Deed by me to Thomas Carpenter and a tract of Land in said Wayne County on Buffalo River, known as my Buffaloes farm or the Arthur Chast Lands, Containing 1235 acres which I purchased at the sale of my Father's property.

Sixthly, I appoint J. W. Doherty Gardiner for my Daughter Artilia Chast, and direct that the Negro man Samuel be left hired out, and if necessary for her support one or more of the other Negroes be also left hired out, and if for her further support and comfort it is needed I direct that my Executor cause to pay her annually the sum of Twenty five Dollars, which sum of Twenty five dollars is to be raised by drawing on the heirs of the other legatees mentioned in this will an amount annually provided in proportion to the value of the Legacies in their hands at the time the said sum of Twenty five dollars may normally be required again to be paid and to direct the same as a charge on said Legacies in the way before expressed during the life of said Daughter Artilia Chast.

Seventhly, I direct that all my personal property not disposed of in this will to be sold the money arising from the said sale of the property and from the collection of my debts &c to be applied to the payment of my debts, and the remainder of any I give to my wife Louisa E. and my Daughter Artilia and Elizabeth A. Doherty to be equally divided between them, and of the collection of my debts owing to me and the sale of the property not specially named and directed to the legatees in this will be not sufficient to pay my debts then I direct that my legatees each be accessory to the value of their respective legacies sum in this will charged with an amount provided for that purpose, according to the value of legacies at the date of my death.

Eighthly, I nominate and appoint J. W. Doherty my Executor to this my will, and request of him a faithful execution of the same, this the 31st day of July A.D. 1863.

such property as she can conveniently spend and
at her death & want an equal distribution of
all my property both real and personal amongst
all my children. And lastly I nominate
and appoint William M Grimes my Executor
to carry out my will and see it be performed
without being bound to security.
