In the name of God Amen. I James Lane of the County of Chester
and State of Pennsylvania living in health of body and of sound mind desiring
in my memory (thanks be to God for the same) calling to mind the mortality
of my body and knowing that it is appointed unto all men once to die
I ordain, constitute and appoint, this my last Will and
testament, that is to say principally and first of all, I give and bequeath
unto the heirs of him of God who gave it, and my body to
be buried in decent Christian burial, then to rest under the
tutor of the slumbering dust of all the dead. As touching
my earthly estate whatsoever it hath pleased God to bestow on me, I give,
bequeath, demise and assign of the same in form and manner following
to wit. First. I direct that all my just and lawful debts including
any funeral expenses, made by living friends and paid out of my personal

estate. Item 2^d I give and bequeath to my son James Lane for aforesaid
expenses the sum of twenty dollars and half thereof, or which Iles and of which
one third and a half is to be paid to him and his heirs or assigns from the sum being due
of an amount due of my late S. Whitman, by him to be paid and suspended
in full at my death. I have given a part and sole in part to him all and
singular my stock of hens, cattle &c and all my working tools and farming
implements, except one spade, one two boar. This I have reserved for my
own use. And I have no positive injunction to let him use an till I except a
hope, that after my death he will pay off his two unmarried sisters who will
then be destitute of a home and unprotected.

Item 3^d I have given and bequeath to my daughter Martha fifty
dollars in a note owing my son James Lane for to be paid in slow goods at
different installments, which note he has discharged and left, and I further
give and bequeath to her one Queen chinc Coffe pot now in my possession.

Item 4^d I give and bequeath to my daughter Magdaline One hundred
dollars in a note on James Lane for that amount to be paid in slow
goods at few annual installments, which note is now nearly discharged.

Item 5^d I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary, One hundred
dollars in two notes, one on William Miller for sixty dollars and one on
James Lane for forty dollars both to be paid in slow goods by install-
ments of ten dollars each annually.

Item 6^d I give and bequeath to my two daughters Magdaline and
Mary and to my wife Elizabeth Farnay all and singular
the residue of my personal estate, including my riding horse (if any
there be), my two cows, my house here furnished of every kind and
description whatsoever, consisting of Bed, bed scenes and furniture, Bureau
closets, cupboard and a furnace, to be equally divided among them unto
this particular attention, that the Bed, Bureau and furniture on which
I lie is to be allotted to Farnay & Lane in part of her share, and their
one third or otherwise to have share go up in the payment of her per-
sonal dues, a just due to the remainder which I leave on her.

Item 7^d All my slaves I give to all my married sons and daughters
who have left such small assistance at the time of their marriage
as my limited means would justify, or who do not give any just cause to
do any thing more for them; desirously, that I give to my son Jacob &
Lane my Walking Staff.

Item 8^d It is my will and desire that all my personal estate
be sold except such beds, laundry, cloths &c as my daughters may
choose to keep for their own use and that the proceeds of the sale
be apportioned out a quarter to the F. Item, so that finally there
may be equal. And I hereby appoint my two sons
Jacob & Lane and James Lane for my executors of this my last
will and testament, hoping they will take the charge upon them
and that they will see that this my last will is carried out.
